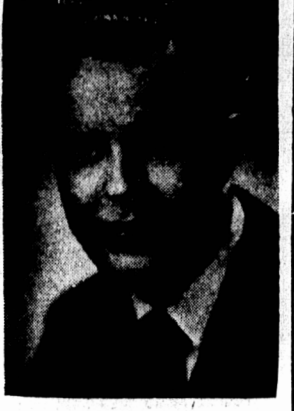
The senior N. G. O.'s played host to the members of Number 401 Squadron on Friday evening, when they held a stag in their Mess.

Montreal Fighter Squadron Begins Intensive Training

Intensive training has started for over 127 officers, N.C.O.'s and airmen of No. 438 City of Montreal Fighter Squadron which arrived at the Summerside Station on Saturday for a two-week summer camp, under their commanding officer, Wing Commander Andre Morrissette A.F.C. The French speaking squadron arrived on three North Stars.

They were greeted on the station by W/C D. A. Willis, D.F.C., commanding officer, No. 438 Squadron is the second reserve squadron to spend its summer camp at Summerside, following after No. 401 City of Westmount Squadron.
