CONCEDES BANK CLAIM

TORONTO (CP) — Philip T. Kelly, a former Ontario mines minister, was assessed \$22,901 by the Ontario Supreme Court on a suit launched by the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce. Evidence was that Kelly, while president of Muskoka Lake Craft Ltd., pledged 5,460 shares of Northern Ontario Natural Gas stock and his company's assets, to obtain bank loans. The bank sold the securities at the market price and sued for \$22,463 they claimed was still due them. The court Wednesday dismissed Kelly's counter-claim for \$134,000 damages.
