ommodation is provided by the overseas country and is usually close to your place of work. Depending on the job, the rent may be free or subsidized.

CUSO picks up the bill for your travel and settling in at your post. Some programs have in-country language training and orientations. CUSO pays your way back at the end of your contract and gives you a resettlement allowance in Canada.

Before you leave for your posting, CUSO will orient you to the culture and climate you are going to and gives some special training (e.g. teacher training) needed to do the job. CUSO also pays for insurance - medical and life - and makes arrangements to defer student loans for those with them.

Your main concern working overseas, as it would be in Canada, is to perform your job competently, but you will be living in a foreign culture, and a sense of humor will go a long way toward making your stay enjoyable and worthwhile. Living and working with people of another culture can provide an awareness and insight that can't be gained in any other way. If you allow yourself to become involved.
