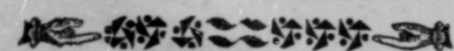

**LIEUT. GOVERNOR HOWLAN.**

THE Honorable Mr. Howlan will, in the course of a few days, bid farewell to Government House. His political career was a long and stirring one, marked by development in many directions. He was a foremost figure in the discussions and negotiations which preceded the construction of the P. E. Island Railway and the Union of P. E. Island with Canada. Speaking generally, he was, when in active politics, ever in the van of progress. It is not wonderful that he should in his declining years have sought the calm of Government House—though not to rest. Since his accession to the Governorship the chief interests of the Province have been his constant care. He has been particularly active in respect to our schools, our dairy industries, the improvement of our orchards and the extension of our commerce. His exertions, together with his unaffected earnestness and the warm hospitality extended at Government House, have combined to make him one of the most useful and popular governors that the Province has ever possessed. Mrs. Howlan and she will retire from the high position they have held during the past five years with the proud consciousness of having earned and fairly won the good will and kindly regard of the people of Prince Edward Island.

As we go to press THE EXAMINER learns that Lieutenant Governor Howlan has received official intimation of the appointment of Lieutenant Governor McIntyre.

**THE JUDICIAL APPOINTMENT**

The Guardian announces that it has "strong reason" to believe that Hon. A. B. Warburton, County Court Judge for King's County, is to be Judge of the County Court of Queen's County, and that Mr. Stanislaus Blanchard, Stipendiary Magistrate, is to be Judge of the County Court of King's County. We have no cause to doubt the accuracy of the Guardian's information. But we shall reserve THE EXAMINER's comments until after the report, which was current yesterday, has been officially verified.

**SUMMED UP.**

The net result of the gerrymander is that some members will represent only 14,000 people, others 50,000. The general purpose of the measure is clearly to give excessive representation to Liberal districts, and only partial representation to Conservative districts. Some of the boundaries now changed have existed for thirty or forty years.

We have today a copy of "Freedom," the Giant of the Orient, for April the 11th, a thrice-a-week "American" newspaper published in Manila. It contains eight pages and is printed in large type. It has the latest war and local news of Manila up to the date of issue, and the world's news clipped from its exchanges up to March 9th. The advertisements are mostly of whiskies, wines, spirits, beer, mail, etc., while in an advertisement for itself Freedom says: "Don't wear yourself out writing letters; send 'Freedom' to the folks at home. Freedom has all the news. Freedom is the soldier's paper." It also contains Kipling's poem, "The White Man's Burden."

**DISMISSAL OF REV. D. McNEILL.**

Among the unexpected and remarkable acts of the Farquharson Administration is the summary dismissal from the Education Office of the Rev. Donald McNeill. This act will, we venture to say, surprise the public almost as much as the Premier's abandonment of principle in respect to the liquor traffic. While Mr. McNeill is, perhaps, past the prime of life, he is as capable as ever of performing the duties of his office. He knows all about it. He has been in it upwards of a quarter of a century under every form of administration. His painstaking ability in the performance of his duties has been recognized by all. While he is a Presbyterian minister he has never permitted his beliefs or feelings to influence his official conduct. It remained for the administration of the Hon. Donald Farquharson to put this veteran official and good man out of the public service with the same scant ceremony as would have been accorded to the veriest idler and incapable. Mr. McNeill was not even asked to resign. He has been turned out and supplanted. Supplanted by whom? Few people know the man. We believe that he is, nominally, a Presbyterian. It is hinted that the influence of his late wife's relatives, who are Roman Catholics, was potent in his behalf. However this may be, we shall look with interest for the Patriot's explanation of the outrage that has been perpetrated in the summary dismissal, without cause assigned, of an old and honored public official.

**The Transvaal Situation.**

LONDON, May 20.—In the House of Commons yesterday the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, gave the names, and the identity of the men arrested at Johannesburg. All of them excepting Tremlett and Fries, were former non-commissioned officers in the British army. He added that President Kruger had informed the British agent at Pretoria that there was no proof that the prisoners were British officers and that in any case the incident would not be allowed to disturb the friendly relations existing. (Cheers)

—The Guardian was disposed not to kick when the Plebiscite majority was flouted. But it is kicking now.

—Mr. Martin's speech on the mail service makes good reading in The Patriot. It is in point of fact the best thing we have seen in the Patriot for a long time. We hope that the Patriot will keep at it.

—It is refreshing to see The Patriot and The Guardian contending over the "principle" that it is wrong for the State to take money from liquor dealers and give the liquor dealers license to sell.

—The gerrymander bill is without doubt as Sir Charles Tupper says "a confession that the Premier is afraid to go back to the electors of Canada, from whom he under very exceptional circumstances obtained power."

**Pasture Farm Wanted.**

His Worship the Mayor is in receipt of a letter from Mr. T. M. Kirkwood, of Sudbury, Ontario, who desires to obtain a thousand acres of land between Summerside and Charlottetown for pasturage. He is willing to take them in farms of 100 or 200 acres each, "as close to each other as possible". Application may be made to the Mayor or to Mr. Kirkwood himself. Mr. Kirkwood will come to see the farms when he hears from those who have places to offer. The opportunity to sell or lease seems to be a good one for land owners; and Mr. Kirkwood is evidently a man to cultivate.

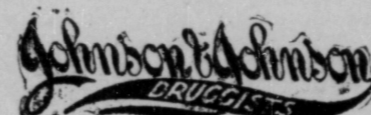

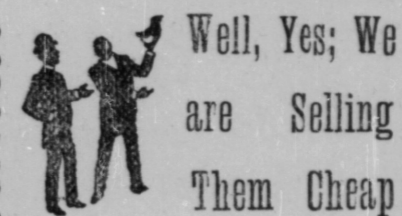
