## Hon. Mr. Pearson Is Nominated

ESPANOLA, Ont. (CP) — External Affairs Minister Pearson Monday night estimated \$8,000,000 will be invested in Canadian development next year.

He spoke at an Algoma East riding Liberal meeting, which unanimously chose him Liberal candidate in the next federal election.

He said 85 per cent of next year's investment figure will be drawn from Canadians' savings.

Mr. Pearson said the threat of world war has diminished within the last eight years but it is not yet considered prudent to decrease Canada's \$2,000,000,000 defence budget.

Federal Works Minister Winters told the meeting that work on the Trans-Canada Highway, due for completion by the end of 1960, is progressing well. He said the federal government recently arranged to pay one-half the cost of the project and 90 per cent of the costs of about 10 per cent of the road.

## Complete 100-Mile Road In Labrador

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—The Daily News says the British Newfoundland Corporation has completed a 100-mile road through the heart of Labrador from the Quebec North Shore and Labrador Railway to Grand Falls on the Hamilton River.

In a Montreal-dated story the paper quotes W. J. Southern, managing director of Brinco, saying "we now have our first surface access route to the Grand Falls." He said the company was negotiating the sale of electric power it plans to develop from the 4,000,000 horse power potential of Grand Falls.

He said the road was built "in the event that heavy equipment should be needed at the Falls."

MONTREAL (CP)—The second of Canada's new anti-submarine escort vessels, the Ottawa, will be commissioned at Canadian Vickers here Nov. 10, it was announced Wednesday.

Addie and her husband rushed to their mothers side and immediately conveyed her to the Charlottetown Hospital where she received immediate medical attention and the last rites of the Holy Catholic Church. At first she seemed to improve and was able to converse with her daughter who remained by her bed side, but in the early hours of Sept. 26th while Rev. Austin MacDonald and Rev. Reginald Phelan were each offering the holy Sacrifices of the mass for her spiritual and temporal welfare she passed peacefully to her eternal reward. Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from henceforth they shall rest from their labors.
