CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

At last evening's meeting of the City Council a letter was read from Mr. L. C. Worby, complaining of a defective sewer on the corner of Great George and Easton Streets.

A letter from police officers Campbell, Carter and Hooper, asking for new overcoats, was referred to the police committee to report upon at next meeting.

The committee appointed to enquire into the matter of the nuisance on Water Street complained of by Mr. John Belger, reported that they had found considerable water in Mr. Belger's cellar, and the street drains were clean and comparatively free from water with a fair descent towards the river.

The building of a substantial sewer from the cellar by the east end of the P. E. R. E. baggage room to the river with a proper water trap system was suggested, the estimated cost of which would be about \$336.

It was thought however, that at the present time the funds of the city would not warrant the expenditure. The report was ordered to lie on the table.

It was unanimously resolved that the City Collector be instructed to advertise all defaulters for real estate taxes for the year 1896, on Friday, the 28th day of November, and to issue executions, if necessary, against all parties in arrears for personal property and poll tax.

The Council then adjourned sine die.
