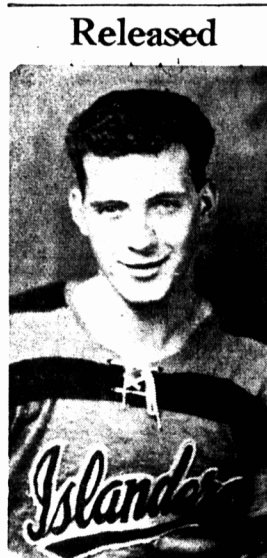


## Capitals Defeat Hawks To Take 3-Point Lead

# SDU Wins Rugby Championship

## Reardon's Field Goal Gives Win Over Tech

St. Dunstan's University, winding up their rugged season with a .566 average, Saturday became Maritime Intercollegiate champions as they defeated Nova Scotia Technical College 5-0 in a rugged contest staged on the frozen, snow-covered St. Dunstan's gridiron.

A field goal by fullback Jack Reardon at the 159 mark of the second half produced the points which won the game and the coveted crown which was held by the Saints two years ago. Team captain Paul Jay scored the three assurance markers at 27:30 of the final half as he picked up the ball just inside Tech's 25-yard line, roared down left wing and plunged across the goal line for the only try of the game. Saints' convert attempt failed.

The game was cleanly played with only nine penalty kicks being handed out by referee Gordon Bennett: five to Tech and four to the Saints. Neither team was able to score on their close-in penalty kicks, partly because of a strong north wind which blew diagonally across the field. Although the match was cleanly played, it was not without serious injury. Shortly before the game ended, forward Emile Juneau of the Tech squad suffered a broken leg as he smoothed a loose ball a couple of feet outside his own goal line. As he fell to the ground his foot apparently caught in the hard surface and his right leg was twisted to the extent that it broke inches above the ankle.

The Tech squad struck hard in the first half in hopes of gaining an early lead and then coasting to victory several times during the session the visitors edged inch by inch to Saints' five-yard line but in each instance were unable to find a hole in the Red and White defence line as it displayed the same fortifying tactics which the Welshmen were unable to dent in the Island junior series.

The Saints got closest to the Tech goal line in the first half when fullback Jack Reardon, who was playing his last game with the local Varsity team, grabbed a pass in neutral territory and raced down the left wing slot to within seven feet of the Tech goal line. As they were pushed back by Tech Rod MacInnis, who played a very strong game, failed to score as he was given two chances on penalty kicks awarded to the Saints. Both drives were at a hard angle, the first from the 25-yard line and the second from about 21 yards.

Play wandered back and forth between the 25-yard lines during and after the half way mark of the game. ## Reardon's Field Goal Gives Win Over Tech

The second half had no sooner started when the Saints put on the pressure and invaded Tech's five-yard zone. Tech were awarded a chance to clear the play out of their ground by a drop-kick before the goal-post bar. In preparation for the kick, Saints lined up on the opposing 25-yard line, leaving Reardon about five yards back. As it turned out, everything worked exactly the same way as the McDonald men had planned and not the way the visitors had anticipated. The kick sent the ball over the heads of the Saints on the 25-yard line and into the hands of the visiting Reardon. Jack took his line and booted the oval directly over the bar and between the posts from whence it came. The Saints continued to press and allowed the visitors inside the Red and White 25-yard line only once in the half.

Dick Wedge, who is also a hockey player of better than average ability, played an exceptionally strong game for the Saints. Dick gained a lot of ground for his team as he ran hard, carried well and passed accurately all afternoon. Wedge was the most effective tackler on the field and had much to do with keeping the Tech men away from scoring. The men who made the best gains by their running were Gus Dorais, Frank Slowey, Rodney McInnis, Lloyd Gaudet and Lewis MacDonald. Johnston Mullins, Ryan and McGaugh were very strong defensively.

By Saturday's win the Saints have gained the right to go on and play the Saint John Mariners for the McCurdy Cup, the game to be played on a neutral field on Nov. 20. The Saints won the Cup two years ago with the Glace Bay Caledonians taking it last season. As yet it is not definite as to whether or not the Saints are interested in the competition this year.
