

Ginger Bread of Various Kinds.

For baking ginger cakes of all kinds, an experienced house wife recommends a moderately heated oven, as these scorch very quickly, and gives the following recipes:

Hard gingerbread—One and a half cups of brown sugar, one and a half cups of West India molasses, one cup of water, one tablespoonful of vinegar one teaspoonful of soda, one half cup of pork gravy or butter, two teaspoonful of cinnamon, half a nutmeg and a tablespoonful of pulverized ginger. Mix with flour as soft as can be rolled, spread in a dripping pan about three-quarters of an inch thick, mark off in strips with a knife so as to break easily.

Soft gingerbread—One cup molasses, one cup of brown sugar, one cup of sour milk, one-half cup of butter, two eggs, one teaspoonful of ginger, four teaspoonful of soda, two teaspoonful of cream of tartar. Make it as stiff with the flour as you can stir it, spread it on a dripping pan an inch thick and bake slowly.

Spiced gingerbread—One cup of molasses, one cup of sugar, one cup of butter, one cup of milk, two and a half cups of flour, four eggs, one teaspoonful of ginger, one of cloves, two teaspoonful of soda. Mix and bake in a deep pan.

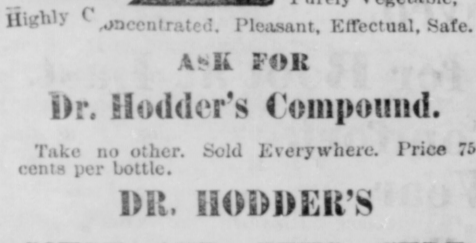
