ALBERTON — The Wilmot Quartet of Fredericton, N. B., received a warm welcome from large numbers of Albertonians for worship on Alberton Pastoral charge of the United Church of Canada.

In the afternoon, Tynish congregation celebrated its 101st anniversary. The guest minister was Rev. C. R. Webber of Summerside.

In his sermon, Mr. Webber noted that an anniversary service is a time of remembrance and reminiscence when the congregation recalls its beginnings and the Christian witness borne

through the years. It is a time of thanksgiving for the past and of beckoning vision for the future.

It should also be a time of commitment to true Christian witness bearing which must be carried out in daily living and in becoming ambassadors of the good news of God's love to all parts of the earth, he said.
