

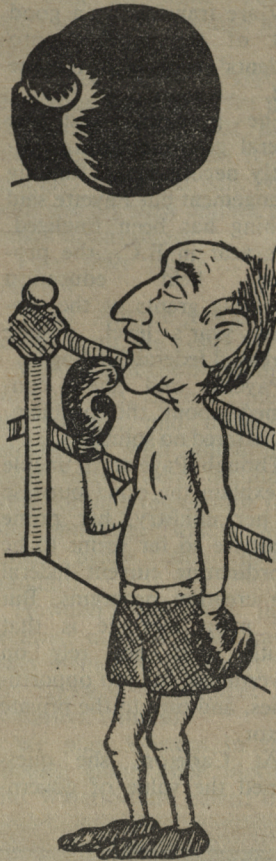

On Wednesday, February 29, 1984, Prime Minister Pierre Eliot Trudeau ended all speculation and announced his resignation as Leader of the Liberal Party. It was the end for a Titan in Canadian politics.
