## VOLLEY ANSWERS ULTIMATUM.

Chinese Led the Attack on Tien Tsin by Firing on Gordon Hall.

New York, August 23.—Dr. G. P. Smith, a medical missionary of the London Mission, who was attached to the hospital at Tien Tsin arrived in the city yesterday on his way to England. He gives the highest praise to the troops of all nationalities who took part in defending the foreigners. He left Tien Tsin some time before the Chinese city was captured, but he was there all the time up to June 5. The fighting began on June 17. On the 19th he said, the Chinese could easily have overwhelmed the foreign settlement if they had attacked the Manchu college. The foreign troops then numbered not much over 2,000 and that part of the line of defence was left unoccupied. Dr. Smith also said:

"I have seen it stated that the allies began the attack, but that is incorrect. The allies sent an ultimatum, demanding the surrender of the Manchu college by 3 p. m., on June 17. At 2.30 the Chinese opened fire. They fired at Gordon Hall, where they knew the women and children were gathered. The first shot struck the building, but low down, and the Chinese could not see it. Then they elevated the gun, and they did not get the range again that day. The Chinese got information from spies all the time. Some spies even let carrier pigeons loose from the foreign section. The hospital was not injured at all, though shells struck all around us. We prayed that none of the wounded in the hospital should die, and none of them were killed."

## THE RICHARDS STOCK CO.

The Richards Stock Co. played at the Academy of Music last Friday and Saturday, and those who attended were loud in their praise of the performances, the consensus of opinion being that the company was the best ever seen here. Friday night The Three Musketeers was put on. Mr. Richards as D'Artagnan, gave a clever interpretation of the devil-may-care guardsman made famous by an elder Dumas, and the remark was made that he was one of the best ever seen in the role. James S. Sheehan, as Kichelieu, gave to the character not only the make up but also the subtle cunning of the great statesman. Bertram Yost as Athos, J. H. Higgins as the King of France, J. M. Byrnes as Boniface, did justice to their parts. Miss Marie Gilmer not only looked Anne of Australia but gave to that character all the strength and dignity of a queen. Miss Cecilia Castelle, as the adventuress, Lady DeWinter, showed herself an actress of ability, while Miss Violet Barney won the hearts of all by her sweet sympathetic performance of Constance. The performance of Faustus Saturday evening well staged, all the effects possible being put on, and nothing alighted. The performance was equal to that of the company's first production. Mr. Richards acted the part of Mephisto in an inimitable style, while the other parts were well carried out. The acting of J. M. Byrnes, as Valentine, and Miss Castelle as Marguerite called forth round after round of applause. The specialties of the Lawrence Sisters, Bertram Yost, Miss Barney and Harry Bowley were of a high order, the latter being as clever a comediana as has ever been seen on the local stage. The company will probably return this way at an date, and put on The Black Play, one of the finest dramas ever written. Should Mr. Richards and his excellent company make up their minds to return, we can assure them a bumper house.—Annapolis Spectator.

## EYES ON WASHINGTON.

Berlin Anxious to See What Uncle Sam Says to Li's Note.

BERLIN, Aug. 23.—Referring to Li Hung Chang's request to Washington for mediation, a high official of the German Foreign Office said yesterday:

"Germany is waiting to see what answer the United States will make. If Washington is convinced that Earl Li represents any responsible Chinese Government, it could, of course, undertake a mediatory role for the establishment of peace, but Germany is confident in any case the United States will not separate themselves from the concert of powers."

Asked if China now offered a satisfactory indemnity for the murder of Baron Von Ketteler, the German minister whether Germany would be willing to make peace, the official replied:

"Matters have not yet advanced far enough to go into that, but there is no question of territorial conquest or of inflicting heavy blows, but merely of re-establishing orderly conditions in China."

## Treaty of Amity Signed.

Washington, August 23.—Minister Storer, at Madrid, informs the State Department that a treaty of amity, commerce and navigation and general intercourse has been signed provisionally by the Minister of State and himself. This practically marks the last step in the complete restoration of relations between Spain and the United States.
