LONDON, April 30.

The Standard says it has reason to believe that the Government does not contemplate the introduction of a bill for the re-distribution of Parliamentary seats, until the result of the census of 1882 is ascertained. It follows that the new Reform Bill could not be laid before Parliament before 1882.

Lord Carlingford has declined the ambassadorship at Constantinople.

Arthur Wellesley Peel is appointed under-secretary for the Home Department.

The Daily News understands that Lord Granville will give his official reception to the foreign ministers to day.

LAHORE, April 30.

A letter has reached Shirpur from Abdul Rahman Khan, stating that he is ready to submit to the British, and hopes that he will not be looked upon with suspicion on account of his long residence in Russia. He denied having received aid from the Russians. He pleads that the people of Afghanistan and Turkistan welcomed him, and he was confident of the suffrages of the rest of the country. Abdul Rahman remitted part of the revenue of Turkistan pending the English settlement.

WASHINGTON, April 30.

Hanlan the oarsman, arrived this afternoon. He will row over the course tomorrow, and go into training next week.
