

Project To Have Economic Survey

An economic and potential traffic survey for the proposed West Point - New Brunswick ferry route will probably get underway this fall, Peter MacCaull, president of West Point Ferries Ltd., said yesterday.

Mr. MacCaull met with Glen Currie, resident engineer for Whitman Bena and Associates in Charlottetown earlier this week, and Mr. Currie is taking up the matter with the Montreal office.

The survey may run into next summer when traffic is heavier, Mr. MacCaull noted.

A P.E.I. - N.B. meeting in Shelburne last weekend decided that this survey should be made first before a decision is made to proceed with the physical survey of the route and harbor.

New Brunswick agreed to share the costs on an equal basis with P.E.I., although they proposed a three way split with the two provinces and Ontario if and when the Physics Bureau is made.

Mr. MacCaull does not agree that Ottawa should be asked to share the physical survey costs because the province should have enough faith in the venture to make the survey themselves.

The engineering firm gave a figure several weeks ago which covered the survey, including the physical probe.

Congregation Will Observe Anniversary At Harrington

Due to the loss of records through the years, or failure to preserve them for posterity, the early history of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Harrington, which this Sunday is observing its anniversary, is shrouded in obscurity.

The first minister of whom there is record was Rev. William MacLaren who in 1857 was appointed to the Brackley Point Road (Harrington) and St. Peter's Road (Marshfield) congregations of the Church of Scotland.

One early document that has survived the ravages of time is a receipt for pew rent, in shillings and pence belonging to Earl MacLennin, Winlose North and which was issued by his grandfather, James MacLennin in 1869 by Duncan Kenney, designated "Collector of North District St. Andrew's Kirk, Brackley Point Road." And a book recording the names and the amount given for pews rents in the possession of Mr. and Mrs. Preston Road, Harrington.

SALISBURY, England (AP)—The Anglican Bishop of Salisbury, Dr. William Anderson, is retiring because, he says, his chauffeur is getting old.

Ted Bealing, 51, is 11 days older than the 70-year-old bishop, who has relinquished his post, said: "I asked myself how much longer it is fair to submit a man of his age to the long drives, not infrequently up to distances of 100 miles, that we were called upon to share almost nightly."

Said the bishop's secretary, "Undoubtedly he considered his driver's welfare in making his final decision to retire."

Said Bealing: "I am retiring at the same time as the bishop, at 51. I couldn't drive for anyone else."

Boy Ran In Front Of Car, Jury Told

SUMMERSIDE — A coroner's jury brought in a verdict of accidental death Thursday evening after inquiring into the death of James William Noye, 7, on Aug. 4 at Inverness, Coroner Dr. W. E. Caldwell presided over the inquest held at the Court House, Summerside.

The young stated death was due to "injuries received when he was accidentally struck by an automobile driven by George Gray of Toronto."

Cnst. Fred Connolly, Summerside detachment, RCMP, testified regarding the investigation of the accident.

Edgar Leo Milligan, a mail driver, told the inquest he had given the boy a drive and when he got out of the vehicle he dashed across the highway without looking out.

John A. Rafferty who lived close to the scene of the accident and who saw it happen, testified that the boy ran in front of the car.

The pathologist's report stated death was due to a broken neck and other injuries.

The young victim was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Noye, of MacNeill's Mills.

Dinsdale Set To Toll Bells Of Halifax Clock

OTTAWA (CP) — Resources Minister Dinsdale will toll the bells of the restored downtown clock in Halifax today to open officially the historic restoration.

The dedication ceremony will take place on the 16th anniversary of the completion of the town clock. It has been restored at a cost of about \$130,000.

Mr. Dinsdale said in a statement Friday that an additional \$238,000 has gone into the restoration to date on the Halifax Citadel.

Allied restoration projects on George Island in Halifax harbor and on the Port Pleasant Park fortifications have cost \$115,000 and \$30,000, to date, respectively.

Mr. Dinsdale said more than \$1,000,000 has been spent by his department on the restoration of the historic Louisbourg fortifications on Cap Breton Island.

"An area's history can have a great tourist business," he said, noting that tourism is the second largest industry in the Atlantic provinces.
