**THE KINDERGARTEN.**  
 "Education," said Froebel, "should lead the child to a knowledge of himself and of nature, and to a knowledge of God and of man, and to the pure and holy life which such knowledge indicates and conditions."  
 This broad definition forms the preface to an exposition of Froebel's educational principles; and to a description of the way in which they are practically applied to the education of young children in kindergartens, together with suggestions as to their adaptation to the work of primary schools.  
 The necessity for study of the nature of the child was emphasized. The body, mind and soul of the child are one, and must be cared for as dependent one upon another. As in our desire for flowers we must cultivate the whole plant, root, stem and leaves, so if we wish a well-developed human being, fitted for the highest attainments, we must satisfy the wants of his whole nature, physical, mental and spiritual. The three-fold nature of the child is so intertwined and mutually dependent that whatever effects one part works changes in the others. If the best methods are used for the development of the one, the others are sympathetically affected. For instance, the attitude we assume, has its effect on our mind and character. The firm, upright carriage of the body tends to assist in producing clearness of thought and honesty of purpose.  
 Interconnected as the faculties are, as an aid to continuity of development, was shown to be desirable even in the earliest school work. The kindergarten gifts induce a gradual process of development based on the connectedness of the subject of study with the child's experience in continuous steps. The study of Nature should reveal to the child the connection of one thing with another, the relations of cause and effect, and this should lead to the thought of his own relationship to the world around him, and to the thought of God as manifested in His works. Reading, writing, spelling, language and drawing can be introduced around the study of literature even in the primary school.  
 The delight of children in stories was among the points brought out. All children love stories, and we may safely decide that in this, as in other directions, the universal desire points to means of development. Historical and scientific facts and moral truths may be clothed by the imagination that unfolding impressions are formed in the child's mind where bare statements would fall unheeded.  
 One great desire of children is to make things, to express their thoughts through the work of their own hands. At first this doing is merely imitative, showing the unconscious effort of the mind to gain knowledge, but the child is not content to copy the work of others; he instinctively desires to do some original touches of his own. On the sand-table, in clay, and on the black-board the children delight in giving representations of facts of history, and of incidents in their everyday life, as well as of the mental pictures formed in their minds through the reading lessons. This work is valuable even if imperfect, for the child is stimulated to more careful study, and the hand and eye are trained to greater power of discrimination.
