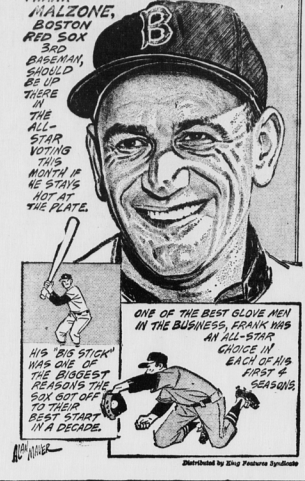

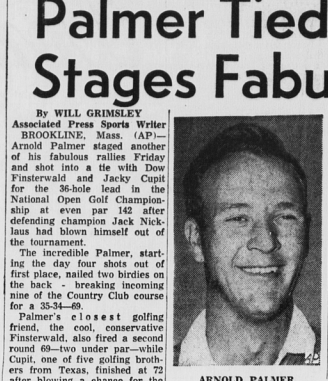

## 3 Football Greats Missed (Final) Fame Selections

Here are three names that should stir up some nostalgia to old-timers and the not-so-old sentimentalists.

Hugh Gall - Joe Krol - Mike Rodden -

Gall was a great one after the turn of the century with the University of Toronto club and coach as an amateur.

He played four years with McGill's University - 1910-1913 - and in 1914 led the team to the old Hamilton Tigers in 1920 to 1928 and finished his coaching year with the Tigers in 1937.

He coached Toronto Argonauts in 1920 and 1926, Toronto Parkdale Canada Club in 1921-22, Toronto Rugby Club in 1923-24 for the last 10 days of the season in 1924, and Tigers 1927-30.

There are scores of other men who belong in the Hall of Fame and Rodden can spill off
