

3 Added to Jury on Ruby

DALLAS (AP)—Two men and a woman were added Wednesday to Jack Ruby's murder trial jury, bringing the total sworn in to eight. A casual defence telephone call knocked off another candidate seemingly on the threshold of acceptance.

A jury panel of two women and six men of the 12 needed now is on hand to try the 32-year-old Ruby, operator of a Dallas striptease club, for the shooting Nov. 24 of Harvey Oswald, accused assassin of President Kennedy.

The trial began Feb. 17 before Judge Joe B. Brown and has picked up speed this week after the defence was turned down in repeated efforts to have it transferred out of Dallas, arguing there was bias here against Ruby.

Latest jurors are R. J. Fichtner Jr., 29, dark-haired salesman for a paper company; Mrs. Gwen L. English, 45, a brunette bookkeeper married to a railroad electrician; and J. G. Holton Jr., 31, a dark-haired mail carrier.

IN POLICE RESERVE
Holton was accepted although he is a member of the police reserve in a Dallas suburb. Earlier, another auxiliary policeman had been disqualified from jury duty.

Jimmie C. Braswell, 26, an engineer with a college education, was under examination when defence lawyer Joe Tonahill left the courtroom. He said afterwards he was acquainted with a first cousin of Braswell living in Jasper, Tex., Tonahill's home town. Tonahill telephoned the cousin, Bob Braswell, to ask about the candidate's qualifications and said he was told:

"He's a good boy, Joe, but he guarded the Oswald home and he's an auxiliary policeman."

With this information, the defence brought out that on the night after the Nov. 22 assassination of Kennedy, Braswell did guard duty outside a home where members of Oswald's family stayed.

JUDGE DISMISSES
On the basis of this information, and the possibility that Braswell might subconsciously be partial to police testimony at the trial, Judge Brown dismissed him.

Afterwards, the defence said they were on the verge of accepting Braswell on the jury before the telephone call.

Construction Aid To Universities Is Announced

OTTAWA (CP)—University construction grants amounting to \$6,951,780 were announced today by the Canada Council.

New construction projects being undertaken by nine universities account for \$6,306,256. The remainder is for additional grants for projects already receiving Canada Council grants.

The council's university capital grants fund provides for grants of up to 50 per cent of the cost of eligible buildings in the arts, humanities and social sciences.

New construction grants include:
St. Mary's University, Halifax, library building, \$220,540; St. Thomas University, St. John's, N.B., men's residence, \$9,875; Loyola College, Montreal, library, \$468,215; University of Montreal, teaching wing, \$300,000.

Additional grants:
Acadia University, Wolfville, N.S., Women's residence, \$52,248; University of King's College, Halifax, women's residence, \$100,000; St. Anne's Church Point, N.S., residence, \$12,653; University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, residence, \$106,932; St. Joseph's University, Moncton, residence, \$58,380; Université de Moncton, Coeur, Bathurst, N.B., residence, \$14,220; Université St.-Louis, Edmundston, N.B., school hall and class rooms, \$10,000; St. Dunstan's University, Charlottetown, library, \$30,948.

Bishop's University, Lennoxville, arts building, \$27,802; Collège Jean de Brebeuf, residence, \$2,197; Collège de Rouyn, library and classrooms, \$13,850; Université de Sherbrooke, residence, \$160,123.

Mining Rush Is Reported

BLIND RIVER, Ont. (CP)—The closing of uranium mines at Elliot Lake and the opening of previously protected park land for staking has touched off the biggest staking rush in this area since the early 1950s.

Three companies now are drilling test holes in an area about 35 miles north of this community 40 miles east of Sault Ste. Marie. Others are reported to be deeply interested.

The hope is that copper and cobalt will be found in sufficient quantities to make mining feasible.

The companies now drilling are Bruce-Presto Mines Ltd., Falconbridge and Prober Ltd. and Crownbridge Mining and Consolidated Samson.

Planes and snowmobiles have been used to carry prospectors to where companies hope will locate the rich sites.
