

IN MEMORIAM

MR. JAMES LLEWELLYN

One by one the familiar faces are leaving from our view, and the loved ones we cherished have gone forever. Thus it was when on March 28 the residents of Murray Harbor North and surrounding districts were saddened when they learned of the death of one of their respected citizens in the person of Mr. James Llewellyn.

The late Mr. Llewellyn had been residing in Charlottetown and returned to his home March 19. That evening on retiring by some unknown circumstance he had the misfortune to meet with a very serious accident, which necessitated his removal to the King's County Hospital, Montague, where all the medical skill and loving care could do for him was done, but to no avail, and on the above date he passed to his eternal reward leaving a bereaved family and a wide circle of friends.

In his 90th year, Mr. Llewellyn was born in Oak Valley, the son of the late John and (Agnes Dickson) Llewellyn. He was twice married, his first wife was Ella May Paulson of Sturgeon, P.E.I. who with an infant child passed away after only a short period of marriage. His second wife was Alice Scutlow of Millview, P.E.I., who passed away 24 years ago leaving a large family, some of them still quite young.

Mr. Llewellyn carried on his farming duties until forced by age to retire. He then went to live with his daughter Agnes, Mrs. Chester MacLure, Murray Harbor North. Having a very intelligent mind and being a great conversationalist, he was very popular with young and old and will be greatly missed by his friends whom he visited frequently. His remains were conveyed from Montague to the home of his daughter, Mrs. Harry Millar, Murray Harbor North, where relatives and friends came to pay their respects to one who had gone in and out among them for so many years.

The funeral which took place March 30, was very largely attended and was conducted in the church at Murray Harbor North where the deceased had worshipped over a period of years. Rev. F. N. Young of Montague, officiating, brought a message of comfort to the sorrowing family. The following hymns were sung, "The Lord's My Shepherd", "Abide With Me" and a selection by the choir "My Saviour First of All", which was a favorite of Mr. Llewellyn's.

Surrounded by his loved ones he was tenderly laid to rest in the cemetery at Murray Harbor North.
