

# Hawks Shut Out Blueshirts 3-0

NEW YORK (AP) — Bobby Hull scored two goals as Chicago Black Hawks handed New York Rangers their 10th straight loss, 3-0, in a National Hockey League game here Sunday night.

The Hawks who strengthened their hold on third place, dominated play to help goalkeeper Glenn Hall earn his sixth shut-out of the season.

A standing-room-only crowd of 15,260 watched as the Rangers were blanked for the second straight time at home. The Blues have scored just two goals in the last 13 periods they have played.

Hull opened the scoring at 14:21 of the second period, converting a goal-mouth pass from defenceman Dollard St. Laurent for his 24th goal of the season.

The Hawks scored twice in the third period, Bob Turner and Hull beating Ranger goalie Gump Worsley. Worsley, in a standout performance, made 37 saves to Hall's 29.

Hull also scored two goals Saturday night when the Hawks lost 5-3 to Boston Bruins at Boston. His pair Sunday gave him 25 for the season to date.

# Canadiens Extend Streak In Trouncing Bruins 5-1

BOSTON (CP) — Montreal Canadiens overpowered Boston Bruins 5-1 Sunday night, striking swiftly for four goals in the middle period and extending their National Hockey League unbeaten streak to 10 games.

Henri Richard broke a scoreless duel at 2:52 of the second period when his backhand bounded off the chest of falling goalie Bruce Gamble and hopped into the net.

Before the session had ended, Don Marshall, Jean Beliveau and Ralph Backstrom also had scored for the visitors. Backstrom's tally was his 21st of the season.

Gilles Tremblay added his 20th in the finale. Nine seconds after Beliveau had pushed the score to 3-0, Boston's Don McKenney collected his 20th goal off a Charlie Burns pass. McKenney now has six consecutive 20-goal campaigns, bettering his own team mark.

Backstrom ran the count to 4-1 with just 17 seconds left in the period, beating Head with his own rebound.

Gilles Tremblay extended the lead to 5-1 at 3:27 of the third, scoring on the second rebound of a Beliveau shot.

STRETCH LEAD  
By winning, the Canadiens stretched their lead atop the standings to four-points as second-place Toronto Maple Leafs were held to a 2-2 tie by Detroit Red Wings in another game.

The Bruins pressed after that and twice had a one-man advantage as a result of Montreal penalties. But the Canadiens defence tightened and they couldn't beat plants.

Plante wound up with 31 saves while Gamble had 34.

# New Zealand's Peter Snell Cracks Elliott's Mark Sat.

WELLINGTON (AP) — Peter Snell, smooth-striding 22-year-old New Zealander, cracked Herb Elliott's world mile record by a 10th of a second Saturday night with a 3:54.4 clocking on a grass track.

Elliott held the world record since he ran the distance in 3:54.5 at Dublin, Aug. 6, 1958, on a cinder track termed exceptionally fast. Grass tracks are generally considered slower than a cinder surface.

Snell, who won the 1960 Olympic 800-meter crown at Rome came from the rear of a field that included two previous sub-four-minute milers and ripped off a 56.4-second final quarter to surpass Elliott's effort.

Continuing the assault on the mile record below the four-minute barrier first broken by Roger Bannister of England with 3:59.4 at Oxford May 6, 1954, Snell finished about 40 yards ahead of Britain's Bruce Tulloh.

# Maple Leafs Battle Wings To 2-2 Draw

DETROIT (AP) — Toronto Maple Leafs overcame an early Detroit two-goal lead for the second straight night Sunday and tied the Red Wings 2-2.

The Leafs, who Saturday night beat the Wings 4-2 in Toronto, battled back for the deadlock on second-period tallies by George Armstrong and Billy Harris.

Armstrong got Toronto's initial goal at 10:39. It was an unassisted marker after he stole Bruce MacGregor's pass. Armstrong beat Sawchuk with a rising 25-footer into the left corner.

Harris squared the score at 12:42, pulling Sawchuk out and slipping the puck behind him. Bert Olmstead did the heavy work on the goal, bringing it across the blueline through a flock of Wings and slipping it to Harris.

# Hockey School At Montague Seen Success

MONTAGUE — Hockey enthusiasts from Morrell, Souris, Rollo Bay, Montague and other points in Kings County attended a most successful hockey school held on Saturday at the Montague Regional High School.

Spectators from Montague were D. Clarkson, Ralph Beck, Bob Ferguson, A. F. Campbell and principal John Hughes.

Dave Boswell, provincial director of physical training, very clearly and precisely outlined the theory of hockey for coaches, players and referees, dwelling at length on rules and regulations.

Mr. Boswell stated that he felt for many reasons the fundamentals should be first taught to youngsters up to the age of approximately 14 years, following which they should be introduced to the game.

At the conclusion of the school, Robert Mills, physical director for Montague schools, thanked Mr. Boswell and expressed the wish that the school were of a longer duration, that further hockey schools should extend into two days.

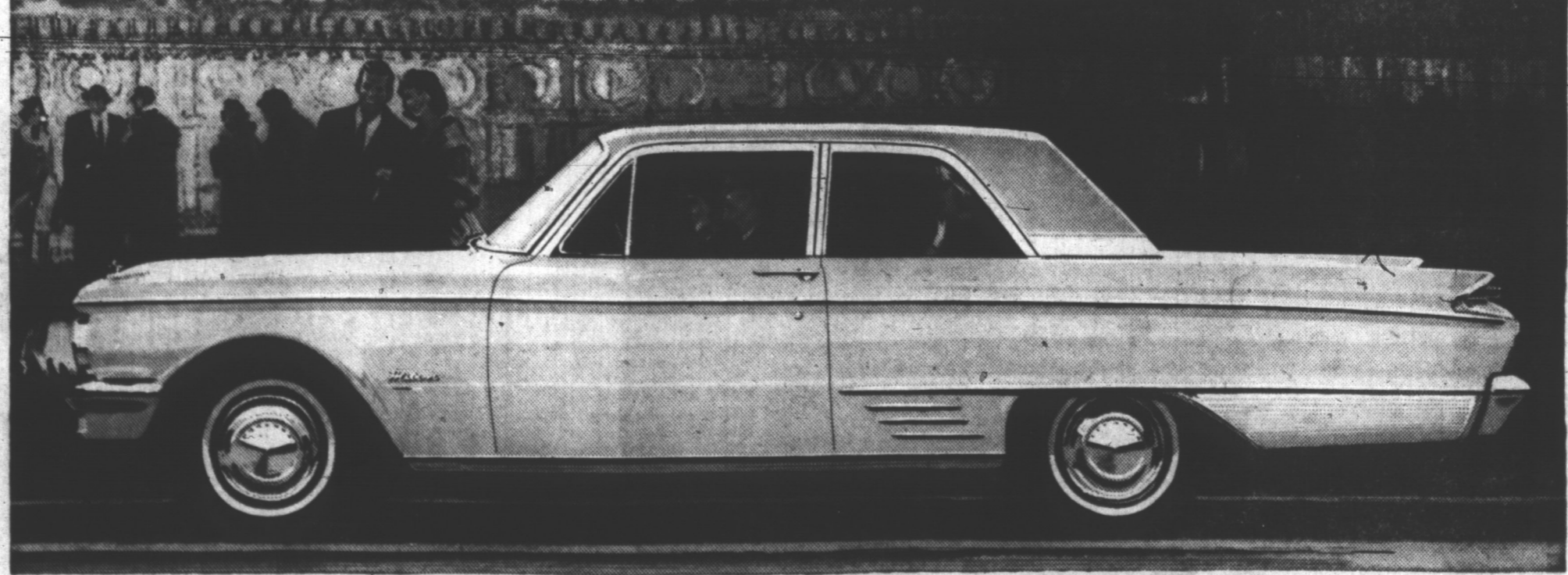
