(Received over Pittfield and Co's Private Wire) NEW YORK, July 2—Crop news continues unfavorable and unless rains appear in the near future business on the farm areas will be affected. Market movements of yesterday were so mixed it is difficult to say what to expect today. Probabilities are, however, that the utility and amusement stocks will be among strong spots. In the utilities we would favor Electric Bond and Share, Electric Power and Light Common and Preferred, North American and Consolidated Edison.

TORONTO, July 2—Central Patricia. Shaft has been completed to one thousand foot level with cross cutting to vein in effect on one thousand foot level. It is anticipated that workings on all four new horizons below five hundred foot level will be in the vein in two months time. Cross cutting to the northwest on 375 foot level is in the vicinity of ore sections disclosed by diamond drilling. Raising ore body has been holed through from 500 to 375 foot levels with particularly good ore results. Ore treatment recently reached 161 tons daily. Output for June is calculated to be in excess of \$100,000.

Cairn Unveiled At Liverpool

Lower St. Lawrence and Lake St. John—Seeding is only now being completed in the northern part of the district. Growing conditions are favourable and a crop well. A very good crop of hay is anticipated. A good crop of small fruits is expected although some damage from frost is reported. In the Eastern Townships and the Ottawa Valley late seeding has been favoured by fine weather in the past two weeks. There has been sufficient rain to stimulate growth and soil conditions are favourable. The hay crop promises to be the best in years. The first strawberries are on the market at a reasonable price. Transplanting of tobacco is well advanced.

Province of Ontario

An average yield of fall wheat is indicated, although the straw is short. Spring grains are now heading and growth is satisfactory. Roots and canning crops are in healthy condition. Corn was planted under favourable conditions and is a good stand. Cutting of a fall is general throughout the province; it is expected to be below average. Pasture continues excellent. Damage from wind and drought necessitated considerable replanting of tobacco, but a good stand has developed.

Maritime Provinces

All cereal crops have advanced rapidly during the past two weeks. Hay shows an excellent stand and a good crop is in prospect. Potatoes and other root crops are all seeded and conditions are favourable to growth. The apple set in the Annapolis Valley is fair to good except where orchards have been damaged by frost. A good crop of small fruits is expected. Pastures are in excellent condition.

Province of British Columbia

Grain crops, tomatoes, potatoes and other vegetables are doing well. The first cutting of alfalfa is of poor quality owing to the heavy rains. Early strawberries were damaged by rain and much of the crop suitable for jam only. The June drop of apples and other tree fruits is heavy and the yield of apples and pears will be below average. Apples are a failure and peaches a light crop. Cherries have split owing to rain, and the crop is estimated at 90 per cent of average. Pasture is good and water for irrigation is plentiful.

Increase In C.P.R. Revenue

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, June 29—Increase of \$968,875 was shown today in May net profits of Canadian Pacific Railway of \$1,450,289, compared with \$1,143,914 for the corresponding month in 1935. Working expenses were \$1,002,193 higher at \$8,772,218, against \$8,770,025, but gross earnings advanced \$1,308,569 to \$11,222,567, compared with \$9,913,938. Net profits for the five months ended May 31 were up \$957,244 at \$5,615,450, compared with \$4,658,206, while working expenses of \$45,471,680,546, an increase of \$3,790,730. Gross earnings advanced from \$46,338,753 to \$51,066,736, a gain of \$4,727,983.

This year for the first time the Holy Father has acceded to the counsel of intimates who heretofore have urged him in vain to make the change in time to escape completely the summer temperatures. The Pope passed his 79th birthday May 31.
