

Jennie Kalmuck And Abner McGraw Win Double Dashes

Jennie Kalmuck, owned and driven by Lorne Letcher of Spring Hill and Abner McGraw, owned by Dr. George Bishop and reined by Elwood Shaw were double dash winners during the Saturday night racing meet at the Charlottetown Driving Park.

Col. Dan MacKinnon's Feather Duster won the third dash and Earl Semple's Mary Merk trotted under the wire a winner in the seventh dash. Prince Budlong and Mighty Deb split the honors in the fourth dash. Money Royal led for the first three quarters of a mile. In the stretch Dale B. and Marion E. moved up to challenge Prince Budlong but were edged out in a driving finish.

It was Mighty Deb all the way in the eighth race. The Deb mare covered the mile in 2:16 4/5 without being pushed. Prince Budlong was second and Marion E. third.

The daily double on Jennie Kalmuck and the quintella on Prince Budlong and Dale B. returned \$17.90 and the quintella on Prince Budlong and Dale B. returned \$118.70.

Lorne Letcher with three wins to his credit was the leading driver. Letcher won twice with Jennie Kalmuck and again with Mighty Deb as he got the Deb mare away to her first good race of the season.

Letcher took Jennie Kalmuck up from fifth position at the three-quarter pole to win the sixth dash in a thrilling battle with Peggy Ellis. Harold Stead, driving Peggy Ellis, also made his move at the three-quarter mark.

The race was the most exciting of the evening. Seven of the eight starters were bunched together at the three-quarter mark with Peggy Ellis and Jennie Kalmuck moving up along the outside.

Peggy Ellis shot into the lead on the upper turn but Jennie Kalmuck moved up in the stretch to win by half a length in a driving finish.

Bud's Echo and Peggy Ellis provided most of the opposition for Jennie in the second dash. Bud's Echo went into the lead on the first turn and led to the stretch only to be nosed out by the Kalmuck mare at the wire.

Abner McGraw had little trouble in winning the first and fifth dashes. He paced under the wire a good two lengths out front in the first dash with Sister Verna, who moved up from last position, finishing second.

Carl Frisco set the pace in both the first and fifth dashes before giving way to Abner McGraw at the three-quarter mark. Sister Verna was second by a length and a half in the fifth race.

Feather Duster, Chet Lynn Clever and Mary Merk battled for leadership during most of the third dash. Feather Duster went into an early lead and remained out front until the upper turn when Mary Merk moved to the top.

However Mary Merk broke at the turn onto the stretch and Feather Duster, reined by Col. Dan, trotted down the stretch a length ahead of Chet Lynn Clever.

Waymark, driven by Don Seaman, fell during this race, throwing driver Seaman heavily to the track. The mishap occurred at the lower turn. Waymark was ruled

out for the seventh race.

The seventh dash was won by Mary Merk. She went away in second position and after beating off an early challenge from Arion-way led the field from wire to wire with Feather Duster placing second.

The date was announced Saturday by Jack Adams, general manager of the Detroit Red Wings whose Stanley Cup winners will oppose the pick of the league's five other teams.

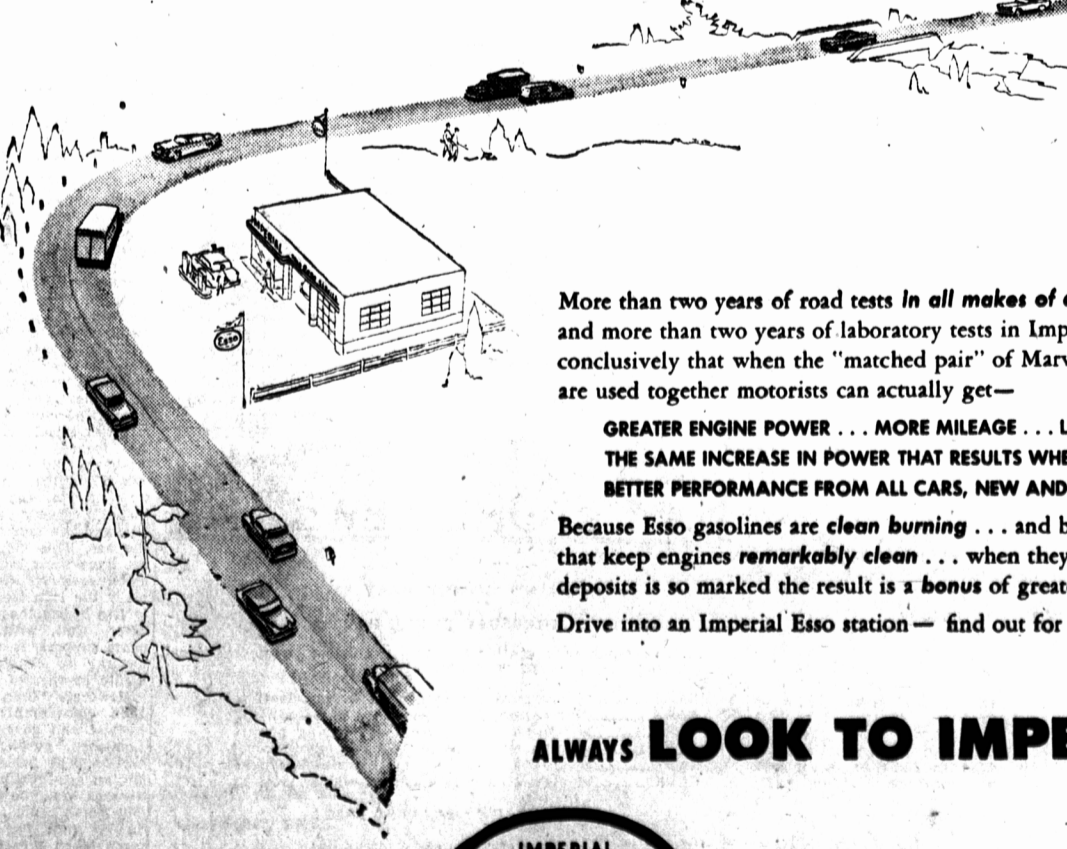
Four members of the all-star team, selected by hockey writers, telecasters and broadcasters, will be playing with Red Wings instead of the all-stars.
