Spur Line Completion Is Set For Two Weeks

MONCTON. — The new spur line constructed at L'Anse-au-Loup, P.E.I., by Canadian National Railways for the department of national defence will be ready for traffic within the next four days.

D.V. Gonder, vice-president and general manager of the company's Atlantic region, said that although primarily designed to serve the RCAF at the Summerside airport, this two-mile rail spur may well be the beginning of considerable development in the area.

Undertaken by Canadian National early in March, the project has reached the stage of ballasting, which is expected to be completed by the April 30 target date. All that will remain to be done when will be the erection of four miles of fencing.

8,000 YARDS

Approximately 8,000 cubic yards of material is being used in the ballasting operation, while drainage provision involved the installation of 400 lineal feet of culvert pipe.

All the work, including the actual track laying, was carried out by CNR work crews.

The spur line branches off the present RCAF siding at Linkletter, one mile from St. Eleanor's, which is two miles west of Summerside, and continues to the eastern side of the airport. It will allow for bulk refuelling and further extension of the airport.

Thieves Net \$15 In Station Break

SUMMERSIDE. — Smashing through a plate glass door in the office of the FNA Service Station operated by Bob Banks at the intersection of Water Street West and Notre Dame Street West, a thief escaped with upwards of \$15 in change from the cash register, sometime Saturday night or Sunday morning.

The intruder crawled through a window to reach the register. The break was discovered by Mr. Banks.
