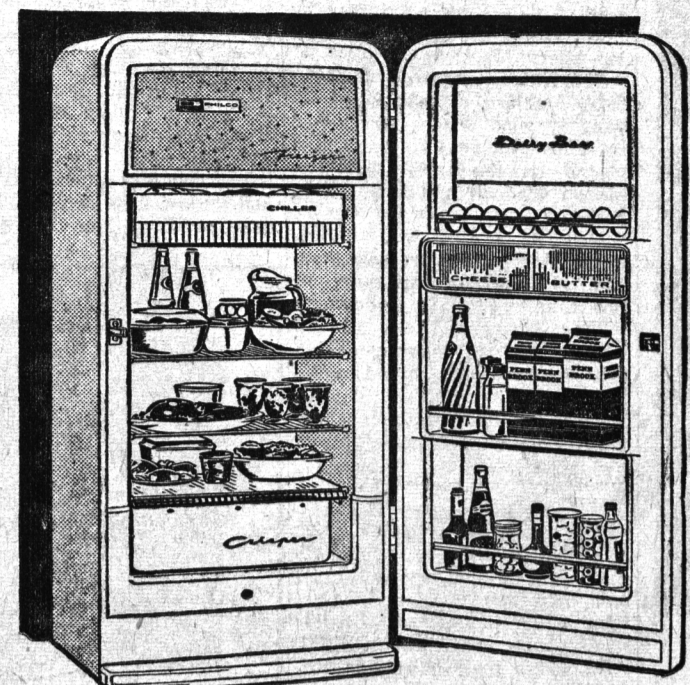

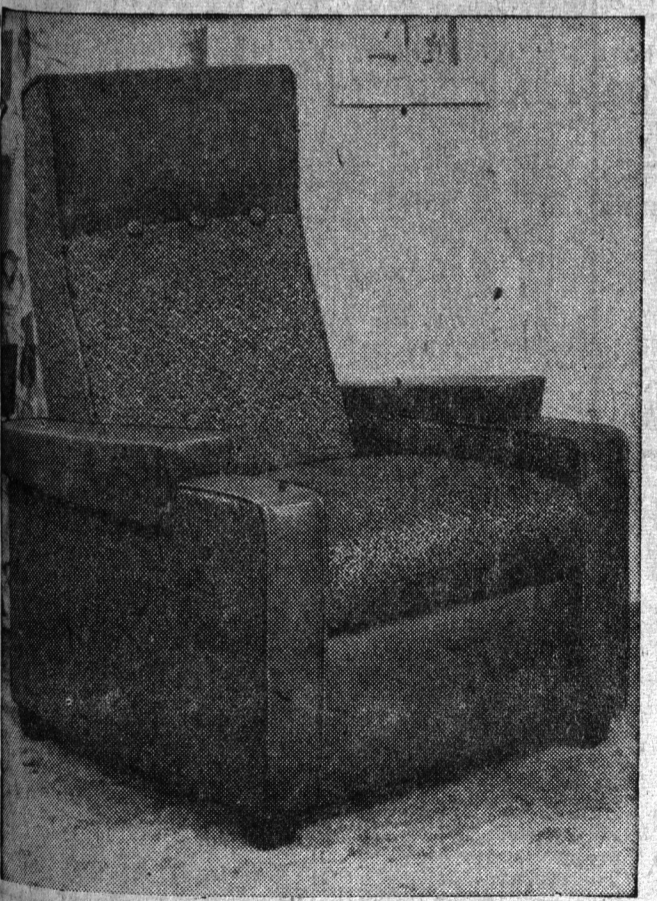

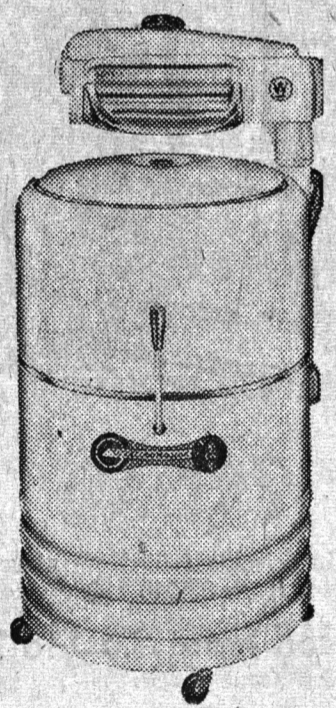

CALGARY (CP) — There have been some mighty big things grown in Calgary but it's a sure bet Sam Conklin has grown probably the biggest apple.

Picture a standard size basketball with a diameter of about nine inches and a circumference of 28 inches. Mr. Conklin has an apple five inches in diameter with a circumference of more than 15 inches.

The tree bearing this "basketball" was planted last May, 3 1/2 months ago.

"It's phenomenal," said Mrs. Conklin. "I've never seen or heard of anything like it."

When he bought the tree it had a blossom on it.

"My wife and I thought it would die when transplanted. Then it sprouted a small green apple and grew, and grew and changed to a lovely hue of yellow."
