Inspector Commends Water Safety Campaign

The Water Safety program sponsored by the Red Cross is I believe, important enough to merit the wholehearted support of every person in this Province," said Inspector E. L. Martin of the P.E.I. Division of the R.C.M.P. in an interview yesterday.
 "Prince Edward Island," he continued, "with its many fine beaches, its numerous lakes, ponds and rivers has much to offer in the way of pleasure and relaxation, but those who go swimming or boating should never forget that failure to obey the simple basic rules of Safety can quickly turn pleasure into tragedy.
 Every year a number of our citizens lose their lives by accidental drownings. In 1956, in this Province the number of drownings exceeded the previous year by six. I am sure that, if every adult made a firm resolution not to take foolish chances and made sure that

children were taught the simple rules of Safety, last year's tragedies would not be repeated, and there would be few, if any, accidental drownings during the remainder of this year.
MOTOR BOATS
 "I should like to make a strong appeal to the operators of motor boats, particularly speed boats not to operate those boats near beaches where people, quite often children, are swimming. The waves caused by high speed motors can be very dangerous to bathers, and in addition, I would point out that the Navigation Safety Regulations of the Canada Shipping Act make it an offence for "any person water sled or other towed object on the inland, minor or other waters of Canada carelessly, or in a manner or at a speed that is dangerous to navigation, life or limb, having regard to waters and the use that at the time is or might

reasonably be expected to be made of such waters." "Any person who contravenes these regulations is guilty to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars."
 "Every year through their swimming classes, their programs to make people safety conscious, and in various other ways, the Red Cross does an exceptionally fine job of helping people to help themselves, and at this time one of the best ways to show our appreciation is to give them our wholehearted co-operation and support, not only during their Water Safety Week of June 16, to 21st, but for fifty-two Water Safety weeks every year."

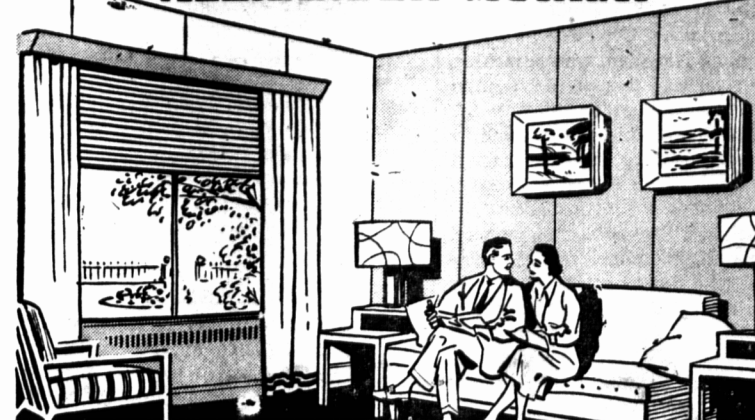
those who came near him. He was finally cornered by a 35-year-old bank messenger with a gun who forced him into the bank's vault where he was subdued.
