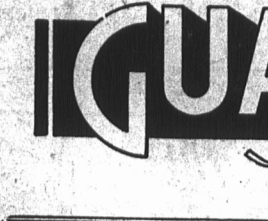
HOLY NAME BOWLING DUCK PINS

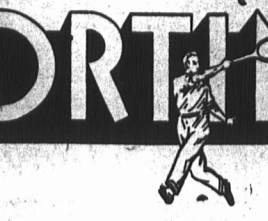


Wind Hampers Marksmen As England Defeats Canada In MacKinnon Trophy Match
