Photos Of Royalty For Coronation Year

OTTAWA, May 28 — (CP) — The state department has announced regulations supplementary to those previously issued in connection with the use of royal emblems and photographs for souvenirs of the Queen's coronation next year. The previous regulations followed those issued in London for souvenirs in the United Kingdom. The amendments state that the Queen has decided that the use of photographs of members of the Royal Family, other than those of the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh, are not appropriate for coronation souvenirs. The statement also said the manufacturers of confectionery may sell candies in special boxes bearing photographs of the Queen or the Duke, or both, during the months of April to August inclusive, of 1953.

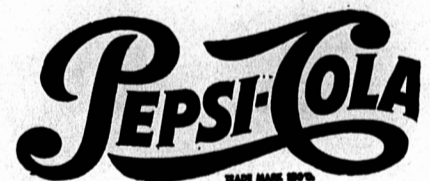

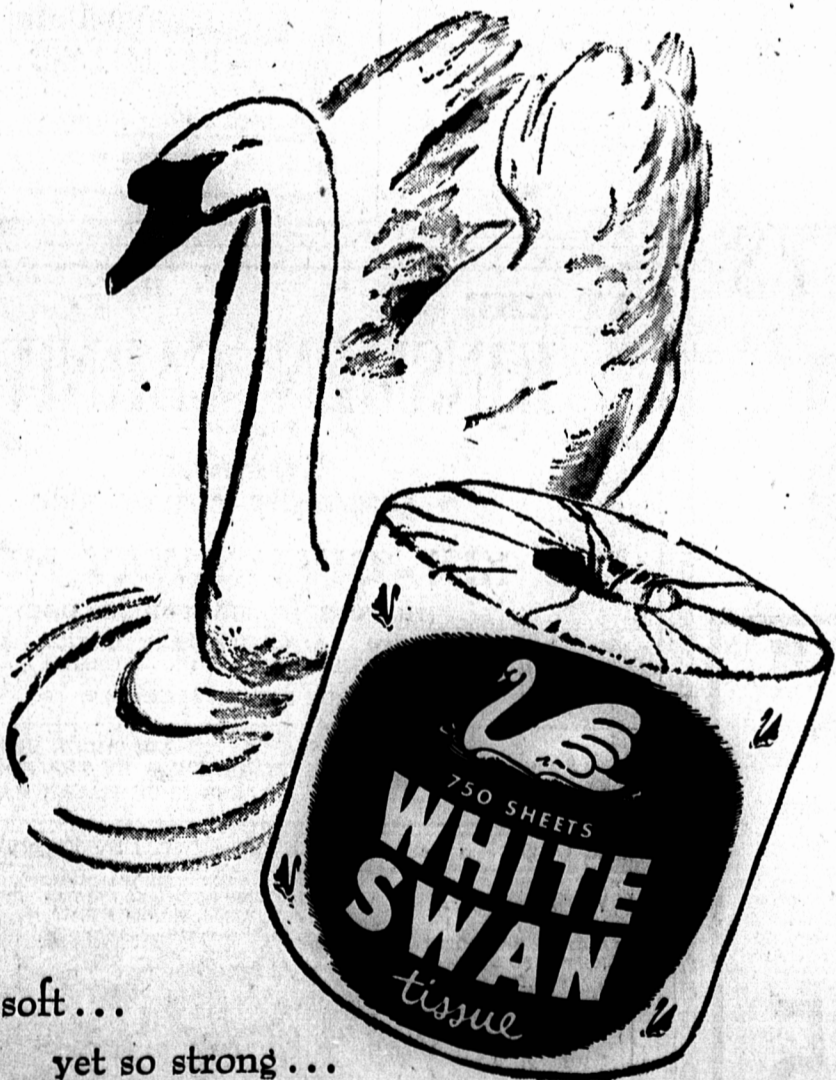

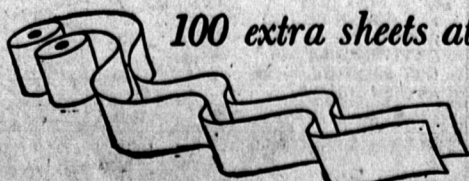
