

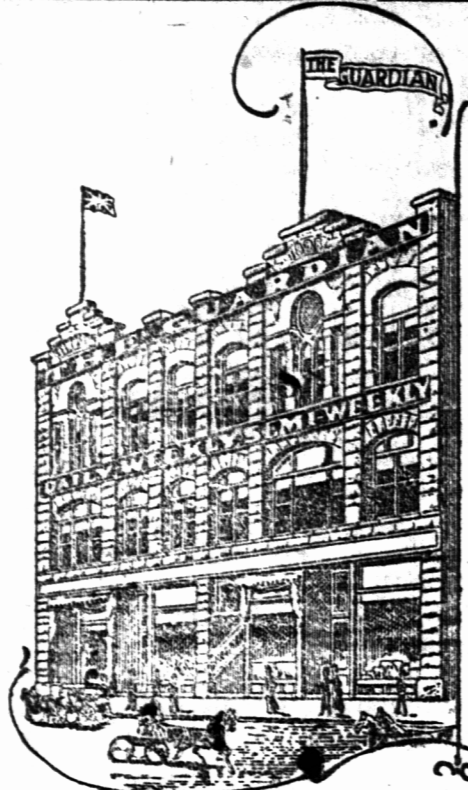

GLIMPSES OF THE LIFE AND TIMES OF REV. DONALD McDONALD.

This volume of eleven chapters and an appendix gives an account of one of the most interesting figures in the history of P. E. Island. Rev. Donald McDonald was born in Perthshire, Scotland, January 1st, 1837, and departed this life at Southport, P. E. I., Feb. 21st, 1902, aged 64 years. The first chapter treats of the first forty-four years of his life work—including two years of missionary work in Cape Breton.

In 1856 he landed on P. E. Island "with the history of which his name will ever be connected." In the second chapter we have an account of his conversion and the beginning of the first great revival under his ministry. "The Progress of the Revival" is the subject of the third chapter. Here the author shows fairness and common sense in his treatment of this difficult question. The "work" as it is called is a word that is used by some "to express the whole work of the spirit upon the soul." Others mean only the outward manifestations when they speak of the "work". Confusion is caused by this ambiguous use of the word. In the next chapter we follow Mr

McDonald to Murray Harbor and Orwell Head and with the planning of the church there, the beginning of what is now one of the most loyal Presbyterian congregations in the Province. Mr. McDonald's visit to N. B. and N. S. is recorded in the next Chapter. In Chapter VI there is an extended reference to the disruption 1843 and the memorable visit of R. v. Norman McLeod to the Island and his interview with Mr. McDonald. Chapter VII deals with "miscellaneous" subjects and Chapter VIII with "The Second Revival 1850-61." In Chapter IX we have an account of Mr. McDonald's illness and death. The subject of the tenth Chapter is the "voluntary motions" while the last Chapter is taken up with Mr. McDonald as an author. Many will be pleased to see the excellent likeness of this well known preacher with which the volume opens also the views of his birth place, the monument that marks his grave at Orwell Head Church and of the church at DeSable as it was in Mr. McDonald's time. There is also a good likeness of Ewen Lamont one of Mr. McDonald's gifted elders and the author of the interesting appendix at the end of the volume. The mechanical work is a credit to the publishers; a few errors will be removed in a second edition; which we predict will be called for before many years. The volume makes profitable and interesting reading, certainly better than the reading matter which forms the mental pabulum of so many modern readers. We congratulate the author upon the excellency of the volume and trust that his labor of love may result in giving the public a truer appreciation of the work and worth of a remarkable servant of God, a successful soul winner, a preacher of rare power and eloquence, and a Christian who literally gave his all to advance the interests of the religion of our Lord.
