The four amateur sailors are Henri Beaudou, 28 (the skipper), Gaston Vanackere, 26, Bernard Sorieul, 24 and Paul Lapointe, 24. They left the Gaspé peninsula town of Cap des Rosiers Friday, after spending four weeks covering the 550-mile distance from Montreal, their starting point. Most of the time was spent looking for ships to tow them down the St. Lawrence River. The 23-by-14-foot raft is made of seven cedar logs lashed with thick rope. Skipper Beaudou and his crew will follow the Gulf stream to Europe, a trip they expect to take about two months. Beaudou, Sorieul and Vanackere are from France and now have their homes in Montreal. Lapointe is a native of Quebec City.

The many friends here of Mrs. Mary D. Deans arrived at Little Sands on June 22 from Haiti, are happy to see her back to her summer home, "Dondoea", Little Sands.

On interviewing Mrs. Deans we heard some of the highlights of her experiences since she left here last September. Here are her own words:

"I went to Haiti last October with Hurricane Hazel. The sea voyage was a frightening experience. After reaching Port-au-Prince, the capital of Haiti, I had to wait there several days because there was no transportation north to my destination, as bridges and roads had been washed away by Hazel. Finally a government plane was released and several of us who had been stranded in Port-au-Prince proceeded north to Cap Haitier."

"There I taught English daily in a Haitian Girls' Mission School. I also had a class in Business English for many government employees, who wanted English conversation — American style. That class met Monday, Wednesday, Thursday from 8:30 p.m. to 10 p.m. On Friday I went by bus or by mule on the road to the Baptist Seminary at Limbe, 15 miles south of Cap Haitier over rough, mountainous roads. There I taught a class in English for two hours to the young men students (Haitians) who will one day complete their theological studies and be pastors of native churches. I usually returned to Cap Haitier Saturday morning by jeep or mule. So that was rather a strenuous program. Next week I am planning to teach Social Studies in the five weeks' Summer School at the Prince of Wales College. Probably I shall return to Dondoea for weekends."
