

### C. F. U. W. Grant \$5200 In Canadian Scholarships

The winners of the Canadian Federation of University Women's Fellowships for the 1957-58 session are all Canadians and graduates of Canadian Universities.

The Travelling Fellowship of \$1,500 was won by Miss Lois Mary Thierman of Swift Current, Sask. She graduated with an Honours B.A. from the University of Saskatchewan in 1953. The same year, she was awarded a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship and began her studies at the University of Michigan. She obtained her Master's degree in Romance Languages in 1954. The following year she received a University Fellowship and in the past year has continued at the University of Michigan as a Teaching Fellow in French. She will go to the University of Paris to do research on her doctoral dissertation, "Sainte-Beuve and the Eighteenth Century."

The Margaret McWilliams Fellowship, also of \$1,500, was awarded to Miss Gabrielle Jane Sellers of Toronto. Graduating from the University of Toronto in 1956, she tied for First Class Honours in Modern History and received one-half of the Maurice Cody prize in History, the G.H. Armstrong Scholarship in Canadian History and the Honour Award of the Student's Administrative Council. She was chosen by the students as their

representative to the World University International Seminar held in Tokyo in the summer of 1955. She is an Honorary Woodrow Wilson fellow. Last year she received a Rotary Foundation Fellowship for graduate work at Somerville College and will remain at Oxford to read for a Bachelor of Letters degree.

The Junior Fellowship of \$1,200 goes to Maureen Patricia Halsall of McMaster University, whose home is in Burlington, Ont. Miss Halsall received the Beta Sigma Phi Scholarship in English for Central Canada Region in 1956. She will go to Radcliffe College, Cambridge, Mass., where she will study toward a Masters' degree. Her particular interest is Renaissance English.

The Professional Fellowship of \$1,000 which is offered to university women for additional professional training, was won by Miss Laura Elaine Freitag of Egansville, Ont. A former teacher, Miss Freitag received an Honours B.A. from Queen's University Kingston, in 1956 and is at present at the Harvard Divinity School on a Rockefeller Theological Fellowship. She will work towards a Master's degree in Education, in the special field of Counselling and Student work.

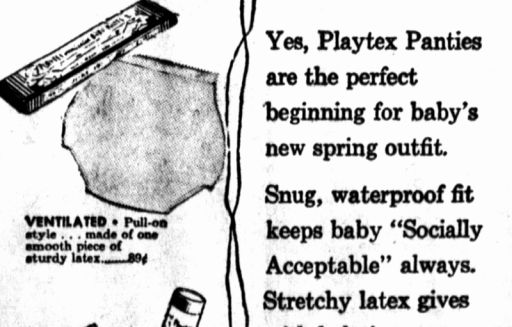

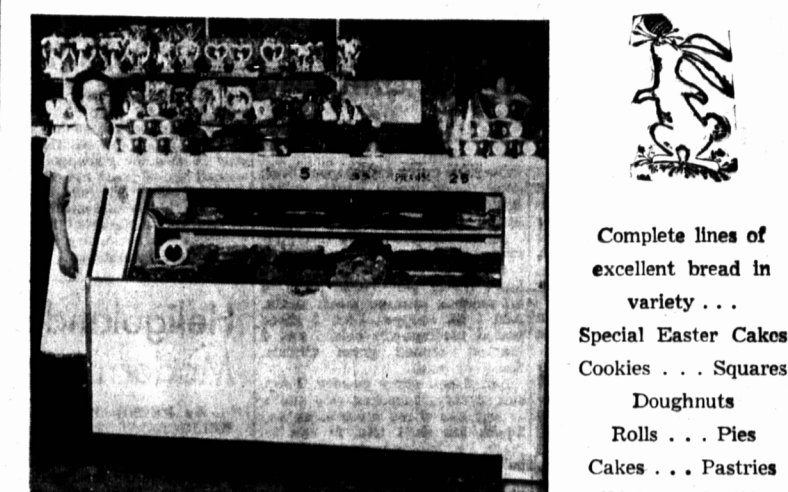
