U.S. Senator Seeks To Have Troops-For-Europe Legislation Re-Written

By W. W. HERCHER WASHINGTON, April 3 (CP) — Senator John Bricker (Rep. Ohio) moved in the Senate tonight to send the troops-for-Europe resolution back to committee and have it rewritten to place sharp curbs on President Truman's power to send soldiers abroad.
