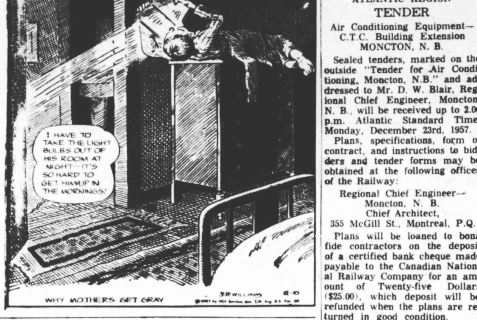

Plan Shipping Service To S. A.

MONTREAL, (CP)—Grace Line
announced plans Sunday for a
weekly shipping service between
the Great Lakes and South Amer-
ica after completion of the St.
Lawrence Seaway in 1959.
A company spokesman said the
application has been made to the
United States Maritime Board for
a subsidy to operate a service
with minimum as an auxiliary
trade route, making cargo
which use it eligible for govern-
ment subsidy.
The company plans Toronto,
Detroit, Milwaukee, Chicago and
Montreal as the points of call in
North America. They likely would
be linked with Arbus and Cura-
cao in the Dutch West Indies,
La Guayra and Maracaibo in
Venezuela.
At present, the line operates a
vessels between the American
East Coast and Caribbean ports
west subsidy.

NEW AIR TERMINAL
