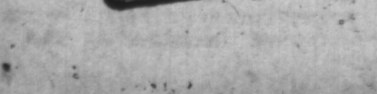

CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Neither side vulnerable. NORTH: K984, 1099, A1095, AJ. WEST: 63, 87, 3743, Q6432. EAST: 72, QJ53, Q86, K975. SOUTH: AQJ105, AK64, K2, 108.

The bidding: South West North East 1 Pass 3 Pass. Opening lead - eight of hearts. Most of the time when you take a finesse, it is against some king, queen, or jack the defender holds.

But here is a case where declarer takes a finesse against a missing five, and while it requires very close attention by declarer to recognize the finessing position that ultimately arises, it is none the less real. West led the eight of hearts. South could see there was a heart and a club loser. He could not afford both or he would go down in the slam.

The heart lead appeared to be top of - nothing - probably a singleton or doubleton. So South covered the eight with the nine, and won the jack with the ace. Then, after drawing two rounds of trumps, and to give himself the maximum chance to make the hand, he cashed the king and ace of diamonds. Declarer hoped the Q-J of diamonds might possibly drop or be ruffed out on the third round, but when neither honor appeared,

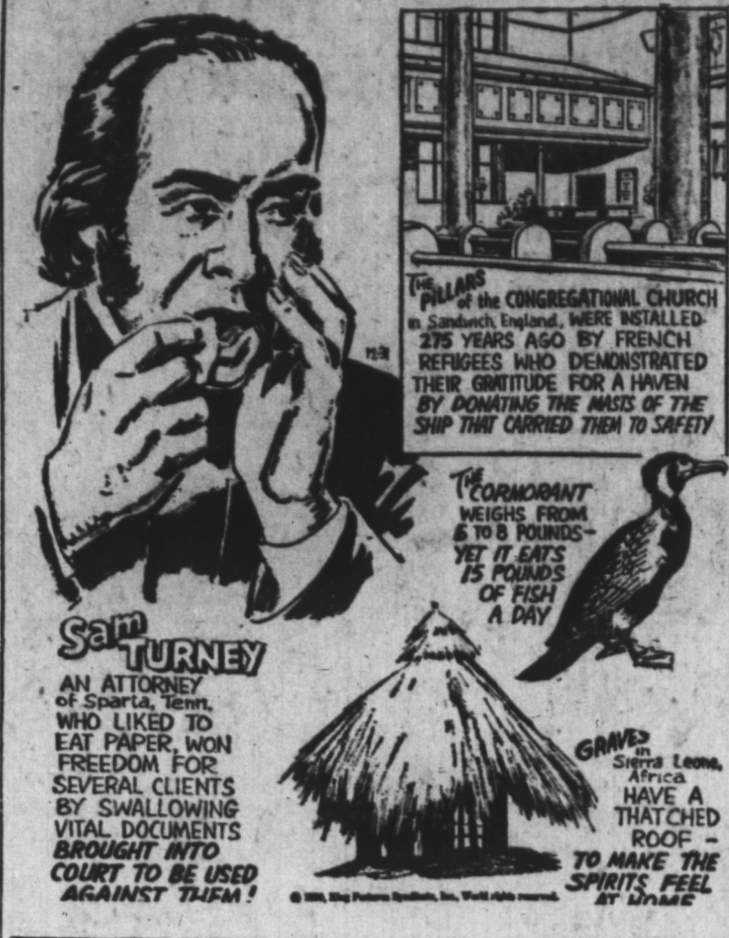

South abandoned diamonds and gave his entire attention to the heart suit. He led the heart ten from dummy. East could not afford to duck, and covered with the queen. Declarer won with the ace, catching West's seven. By this time South had the 6-4 left, while East had the 5-3. Dummy was next entered with a trump, and the deuce of hearts was led. When East produced the three, declarer finessed the four! And then, on the good six, South was able to discard a club from dummy, and wound up making seven.

The hand demonstrates that there is no limit to the depth of a finesse. But you do have to keep your eye closely peeled to the business at hand to realize that, after two rounds of a suit are led, the six-spot is the master card and that the four can assume a rank high enough to attain a finessing status.

Gerry James To Miss Games

TORONTO (CP) - Gerry James, the hockey and football star, will be out of the Toronto Maple Leaf hockey lineup for at least a week with an attack of plebitis, coach-manager George (Punch) Imlach said Tuesday. 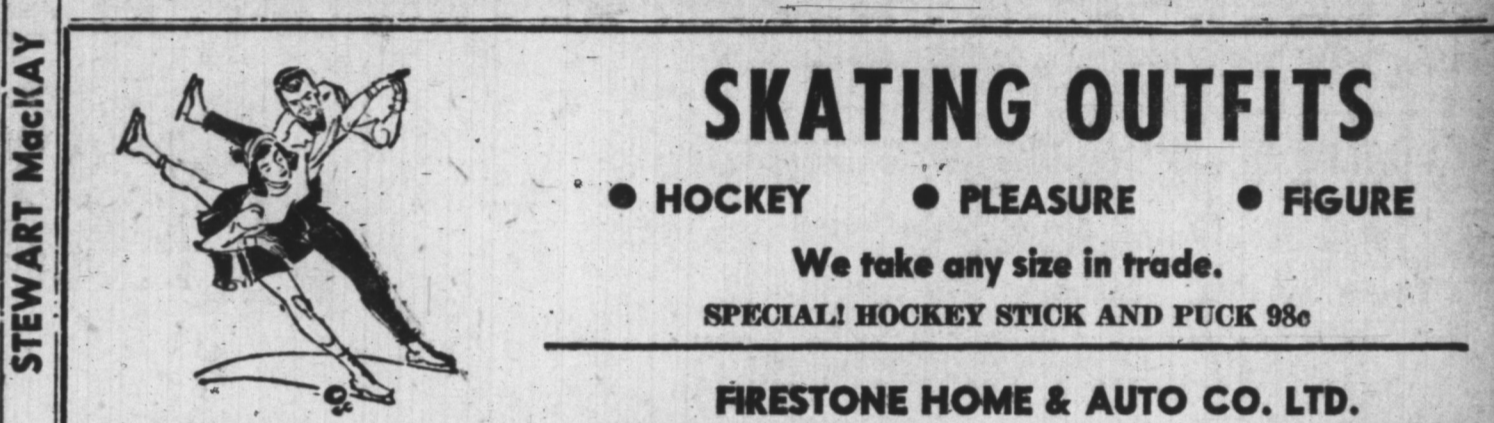

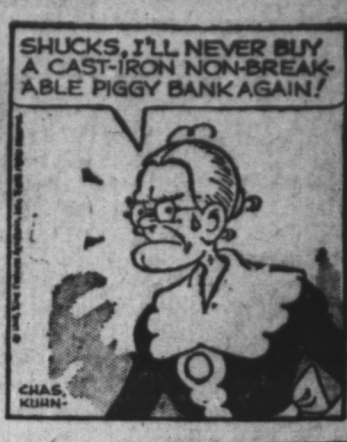

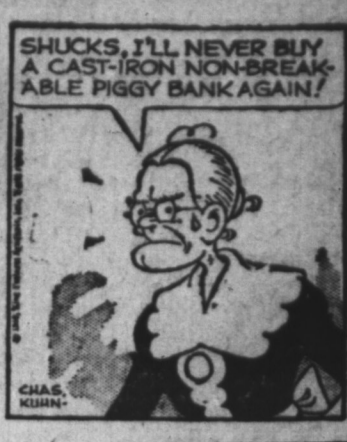
