War in The Transvaal

Particulars of the Struggle in South Africa.

PRISONERS AT PRETORIA. British Captive Describes the Daily Life of the Prisoners.

The Paris Figaro publishes a long letter which an English officer, a prisoner of war in Pretoria, has written to a member of his family. The writer, who signs himself "Reggie," says:—"We are completely cut off from all news of the outside world, and are not allowed the newspapers. We know, however, of Ladysmith being bombarded.

"Here we are prisoners of war, and I assure you it is a pitiful condition. Sometimes I feel as if I were going mad and wish I had been shot. We had hoped we should be exchanged or released on parole, but the Boer authorities do not appear to understand what parole means, and seem to think we should not keep our word.

"As far as health goes, we are all well and very well treated. We sometimes receive visits from those in command at Pretoria—the Secretary of War, field cornets, chief magistrate, and others. They are all very polite but are under the firm impression that their prisoners are not well treated by us, and they are convinced that our troops use 'dum-dum' bullets. "At first we were nine officers prisoners and about 180 men, but our number was increased by forty-five officers, almost all officers of the Gloucester Regiment and Royal Irish Fusiliers, with Colonel Carleton. So that now we are about fifty-four officers and 1,400 men.

In front of the building there is a verandah, on which we sit and watch the people go by. The Government gives us canned beef, bread, and water to drink, and from time to time lime juice.

Once a week we get potatoes. Happily we are now allowed to buy whatever we please, so we have been able to organize a mess, and our menu is reinforced by bacon, porridge, preserved vegetables, potted meats, pickles and tobacco.

"Each day we send out our orders and the things come later. Of course, when taken prisoners we had only what was on our persons, so we had to purchase many necessities, such as sponges, soap, tooth brushes, hair brushes and combs. The Transvaal Government, however, has given to each of us an iron bedstead, with mattress and pillow, a pyjama suit, slippers, flannel shirt, pocket handkerchief, towels, socks, etc. We also received ready-made suits, as our khaki uniforms were too much worn.

Kept in a School-House. "We officers live in a large building that was formerly used as a school-house. The men are still kept on the race course. We are certainly far more comfortable than we were on the race course, for this is a stone building, while on the race course are nothing but zinc shed. It is, however, not so warm as the race course prison. We are not so much annoyed by flies, but at night there are a good many mosquitoes. We are guided night and day by a strong police force, although none of us has any intention of trying to escape. We are surrounded by iron palisades. Behind the house there is a small grass plot, on which a little zinc hut has been erected to serve as a kitchen. Here tents have been put up for servants. We were allowed to bring ten men from the race course to act for

us. There are also teats for the guard and a zinc hut which does duty as a bath-room. We rise at half-past six o'clock and indulge in a cold bath. When I am dressed I walk around the building eight, times, which makes a mile.

How the Day is Passed.
 "At half-past eight we breakfast on porridge, bacon, sardines, butter, jams, and tea or coffee. They give us the tea and coffee and bread, and the rest we buy. After breakfast we generally read and smoke until lunch time, at one o'clock, when we get beer, bread butter, jam and water. The afternoon seems very long. At half-past four we have tea and at seven dinner. After dinner some of us play whist or chess, while others read. I generally go to bed at half-past nine o'clock. Our cheques are provided. They are countersigned by the senior officers, and cashed."

Prof. McCormac, president of the Royal College of Surgeons, who volunteered his services in South Africa, sends, the Lancet some interesting surgical observations confirming the comparative harmlessness of the Mauser bullet which has amazed the surgeons. He says: "To anyone familiar with the frightful extent of the damage done by the needle gun and chasspot in the Franco-German war, many wounds caused by the Mausers might be regarded as somewhat of the character of a pin-prick."

In Bombay the clerico astronomers, or wise men of India, attribute the reverses of the British in South Africa to the junction of the planets Mercury and Jupiter, but an English missionary there, strong in his Anglican orthodoxy, insists that the British defeats are the visitations of Heaven intended to punish his countrymen for their sinful leanings toward ritualism and the papacy.

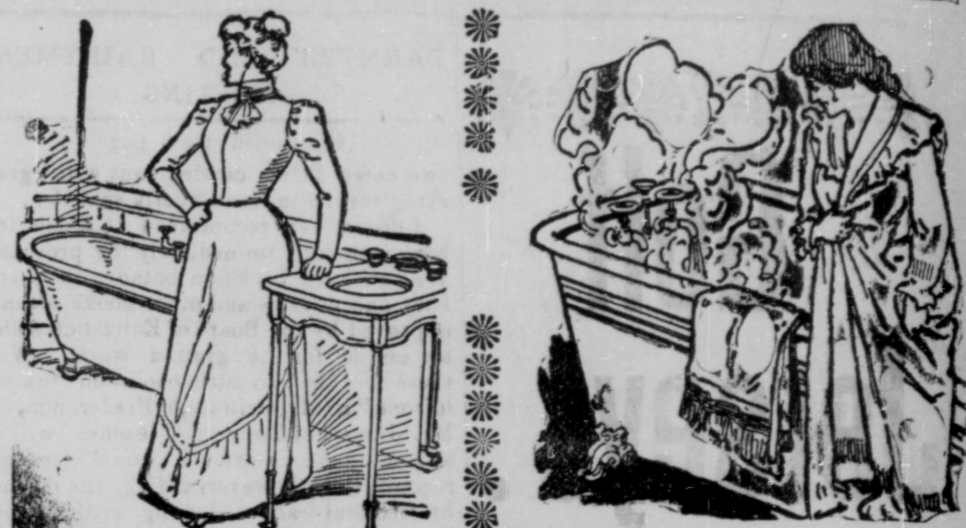
