Profit-Taking Hits TV Stock

On N. Y. Exchange
NEW YORK, April 16 (AP)-
Radio-television stocks got mused up Saturday after Friday's sensational rise.

A wave of profit-taking sales rolled over TV issues at the opening and losses soon ranged to around two points. Then a lively rally developed to push them into high ground.

Toward the close of the two-hour stretch, selling forces took another wallop at the TV group and the gains were wiped out or trimmed.

The rest of the market showed a distinctly soggy undertone. Losses ranged to around a point and were widely distributed.

Trading was heavy for a Saturday, sales totalling 1,430,000 shares compared with 1,090,000 a week ago.

Interest in TV stocks, the prima donnas of this year's market, flared up late Thursday. An earnings statement by Admiral Corp. was the spark that touched off the fire works.

Friday the TV group took off again as another earnings report issued by Motorola (this time-supplied fresh buying fuel).

TV stocks held up surprisingly well Saturday in the face of smashing profit-taking sales.

Canadian issues Saturday were steady or fractionally off. Distillers Seagrams, Dome Mines and Hiram Walker each dipped 1-8. Canadian Pacific and McIntyre were unchanged.

Off the curb, Royalite Oil was off 1-8. Unchanged were Imperial Oil (coupon), Imperial Oil (regular), Giant Yellowknife and Lake Shore.

Stocks Show Easier Trend At Montreal

MONTREAL, April 16 (CP)-
Stock prices showed a mainly easier tone in the brief Saturday session on Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market.

Trading was active, with an industrial volume of 69,800 shares and mines 99,200 shares. Minus and plus signs were generally held to small fractions, with the odd issues moving around a point or more.

The exchange's closing averages showed banks off 0.02 at 30.04; utilities off 0.4 at 81.9; industrials off 0.5 at 148.3; combined off 0.4 at 126.2; papers up 0.64 at 429.27 and golds off 0.03 at 66.24.

In papers, Consolidated Paper was up 1-4 at 22 3-8 and MacLaren up 1-2 at 42, while Abitibi Preferred was off 1-8 at 23 7-8, Fraser off 3-4 at 27 and International Paper off 1-2 at 43 3-4.

In utilities, Brazilian Traction declined 1-8 at 23 7-8, Bell was off 1-8 at 40 3-4, Shawinigan off 3-8 at 25 and International Utilities off 7-8 at 22 5-8.

Aluminum advanced 1-4 at a new high of 63 in basic metals, while Consolidated Smelters was down one at 97 and Nickel down 1-4 at 31. Imperial Oil was up 1-2 at 26 1-4, while Royalite was off 1-8 at 12 7-8.

Losers included Montreal Tramways 1 3-4 at 68 1-2, Walker one at 45, Ford "A" 3-4-5 3-4, Montreal Locomotive 1-4 at 21 7-8 and United Steel 1-8 at seven.

Among gainers were Argus Preferred two at a new high of 80, Canadian Silks one at a new high of 29, Sicks' 5-8 at 22 1-8, Asbestos 1-2 at 26 1-2 and Dominion Coal Preferred 1-4 at 21 1-4.

In mines and western oils, Lake Shore was up 25 cents at \$12.86 1-2, Calgary and Edmonton up 3/4 1-2, at \$2.30 and Federated Petroleum up five cents at \$3.10, while Hollinger was off 12 1-2 cents at \$10.75. Calvar off five cents at a new low of \$4.90 and Home Oil off 25 cents at \$13.75.

Of the 176 issues traded, 46 were up, 64 down and 66 unchanged.
