**Contract Bridge**

NOTHING SENSATIONAL  
A deal such as today's does not require an advanced play of any kind—no squeeze, coup or even throw-in play—but simply a common-sense view of the timing.  
South dealer.

The bidding:  
South West North East  
1 ♠ Pass 1 NT Pass  
2 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ Pass  
4 ♠ Pass Pass Pass

Three rounds of diamonds were played at the start, South ruffing the third round. South saw that his spade suit might not run without loss, and he also saw that he would have to establish it before drawing trumps, so he cashed the ace and king and ruffed a third round with dummy's heart jack, to prevent an over-ruff. But now he counted tricks and realized that he would need a club to reach the right total. He was a little late, however, because when he led the club king, West won and returned his spade jack—and declarer again had to ruff high in dummy to shut East out. The consequence was that South had to lose a trump trick to East, because of all this high ruffing, and the contract was down one.  
South's timing was not good! Observe how easy and safe it is to make four hearts on this hand—as follows:  
After South ruffs the third diamond lead, he should go out for a club trick immediately. Why not? He has full control at this point, and there is no immediate need for spade establishment. It matters little whether West puts up the club ace or ducks—let's assume the latter. Then, having won his club trick, South shifts to spades. He cashes two top cards in the suit and can afford the high ruff in dummy of a low spade. His two remaining spades are now good, so he simply trumps, ending up in his own hand of course, and cashes his spades to fulfill the contract.  
It is true that a 4-1 trump break would upset this plan, whereas, if the missing spades were 3-2, South could win out by drawing trumps (after getting the club home) and running all the spades. However, a 3-2 break of five missing cards (as in hearts) is substantially more probable than a 3-3 break of six missing cards (as in spades).
