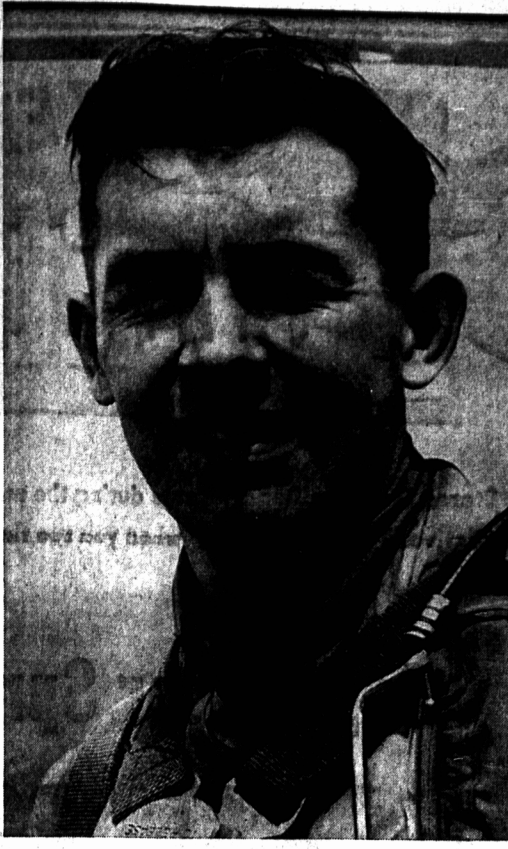
Fine Truck Handling Display At R. C. A. F. Rodeo Yesterday

Observers termed the R.C.A.F. truck rodeo, held at Station Summerside yesterday afternoon and won by Lac. Robert F. Enman, an exceptional display of truck handling. The rodeo was designed to test the driving skill and safety of R.C.A.F. drivers and those of the Maritime Air Command Rodeo, which will be held at R.C.A.F. Station Summerside on the 20th and 21st of September.

The winning driver in Friday's competition, Lac. Enman, of Victoria West, P.E.I. is employed with the Station's Mobile Equipment Section. In winning the competition, Lac. Enman scored 388 points out of a possible 400. Lac. Gordon H. Crossman of Summerside placed second, scoring 316 points and Mr. Alphonse Arsenault of Summerside was awarded third prize, having scored 308 points. The three drivers were chosen from a field of ten R.C.A.F. and Department of National Defence employees, after each driver had completed the complicated obstacle course. All drivers demonstrated exceptional driving skill while observing safety regulations. Although the three winners were awarded prizes, only the two leaders will enter the Maritime Air Command competition during September.
