"Rockets are pretty complicated pieces of equipment and in every new piece of equipment, there is always a question of reliability—even in designing a typewriter," he said in an interview. "It is a serious and costly problem, though not as costly as some politicians suggest."

You take account of the reliability problem by adding to the number of missiles put into operation. Every system has its own problems. On the satellite, you judge that some of the soldiers won't be able to get through the enemy lines and so you add to your forces to take that factor into account."

McClure is a team of about 100 scientists and technicians drawn from all parts of the U.S.
