## Local and Other Items.

**GOSPEL MEETING.**—Railway men's meeting in Wright's Hall Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock. Strangers always welcome. Lesson, Matthew 16-18. "Upon this rock I will build My Church."

**PLAYED WITH MATCHES.**—A five-year-old child of Mr. Bourbeau, merchant of Asbestos, Que., while playing with matches, set fire to his clothing, receiving burns resulting in death a few hours afterwards.

**COTTON MILL EXEMPTION.**—It is said that the Moncton city council will recommend an assessment not exceeding \$30,000 for twenty years on the cotton mill after the present exemption expires. It is expected the property will be greatly increased.

**HAD A CLOSE CALL.**—Andrew Findlay, of Horwich township, in the vicinity of Chatham, Ont., is congratulating himself upon a narrow escape from death. He was thrown in front of a binder attached to three runaway horses, but just as the knives of the machine reached him the wheel ran over a sheaf of wheat, and he passed under the bar of the cutter. His hat was torn from his head and cut to shreds.

**AN INSANE ACT.**—A sad case was reported to the police at Point St. Charles, where an insane woman named Mrs. Alex. Lebrèque took her little girl aged 6 years, and dragging the poor little thing by the hand jumped into the canal. Both bodies were recovered soon after the affair was over, but life was extinct. It appears that the woman has been out of her mind for some time past, but as she was perfectly harmless no such sad ending was dreamed of.—Quebec Telegraph.

**ANOTHER MIRACLE REPORTED.**—Another miracle from the sacred shrine of Ste. Anne de Beaupre is reported by Mr. Ed Deveau, of Metcalfe street, who accompanied the pilgrimage on Saturday last. Mr. Brestly, of Church street, Ottawa, who for several years has been partially paralysed and unable to walk, was almost completely cured of his infirmity. Rev. Canon Campeau received the man's confession and dispensed the holy communion. Immediately afterwards the paralytic was able to walk. He will return to the shrine in August and endeavour to obtain a complete cure.—Ottawa Citizen.

**A BIG FAMILY.**—Levi Bradshaw, a wiry looking little man of Canadian birth, lives at Killingly, Conn. He is in his seventy-first year. He has been married three times, and is the father of forty-one children, forty of whom are living. By his first wife he had six children, including a pair of twins. His second wife bore him twenty-four children, half of whom were twins. His present wife presented him with eleven children. Bradshaw was not fourteen when he married the first time. The eldest son is now forty-four and has several children and grandchildren. Twenty-nine of the old man's sons and daughters are married, and all have children. The grandfather does not know just how large his family of grandchildren and great grandchildren has become. He can enumerate up to 150, but is in the dark as to the remainder. He estimates that they may run up to 200 or so.
