The Houlton, Me., correspondent of The Journal writes: Owing to the large surplus of potatoes in Aroostook county, and the limited demand for shipment, the starch factories are contracting for large quantities at 65 cents per barrel, and will grind and manufacture into starch thousands of bushels during the spring.
