**Tobacco Auctions  
Re-open In Ont.**

**(AYLMER, Ont. (CP))**—Three tobacco auction houses in the heart of southwestern Ontario's tobacco belt have opened again for business today after three weeks after they were forced to close by growers. But farmers who had hoped to find higher tobacco prices when the auctions resumed were disappointed. Prices offered by cigarette manufacturers buying subsidiaries were below what the farmers considered a fair price. Some farmers told reporters that many of them will take what they can get now so the estimated 65,000,000 pounds of tobacco still unsold a third of last year's crop—can be moved.

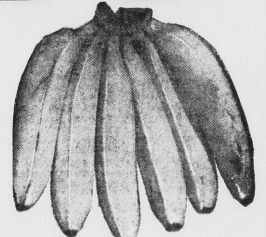
