

# Accused Refuses Answer In Court

Charged with possession of stolen goods, valued at under \$50, Louis James MacGregor, Charlottetown, was remanded for one week, following his refusal to answer a question of the court as to where he obtained an illegal quantity of liquor.

Crown Prosecutor Alan K. Scates, called four witnesses during the trial before Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court Tuesday.

**REFUSED ANSWER**  
The accused had taken the stand in his own defence, when called by his attorney, John Holmes. When cross-examined as to where he got liquor at six o'clock in the morning, he refused to answer the question. Crown witnesses were: Peter Sauer, Savage Harbor, and Ronald Alexander MacGregor, Royalty, security officers for Canada Packers Ltd., Charlottetown; Joseph Molloy, superintendent of Canada Packers; and Const. William Ford, arresting officer.

**SUSPENDED SENTENCE**  
A two-year suspended sentence, with two bonds of \$2,500 each, was levied on Richard D. MacKinnon, 2 Brighton Road, charged with intimidation. The suspended sentence was given because there is no alternative of a fine for such an offence.

When handing down the sentence, the magistrate warned the accused, if he did not obey the conditions of the sentence, he would lose his freedom. The accused was represented by Allison Gillis.

A city man, charged with possession of liquor in a place other than his residence, was fined \$25 and costs or 30 days.

# Three Oldest Stars Found To Be Giants

BY RALPH DIGHTIN PASADENA, Calif. (AP)—A study of the three oldest stars yet found shows three must

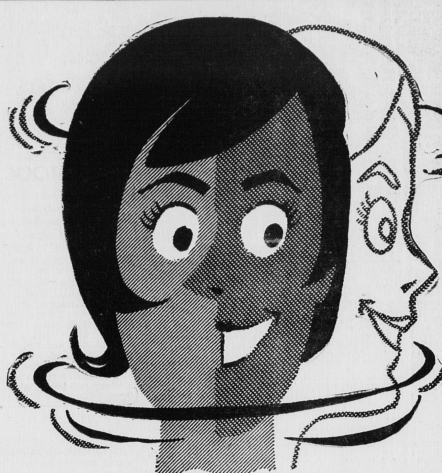
have been other stars in existence when these giant antiquities were born almost 10,000,000 years ago.

Analysis of the light from these stars, announced here by the California Institute of Technology, indicates they are nearly twice the age of the sun, 20 to 30 times in diameter, and 500 to 1,000 light years away. One light year is the distance that 186,000-mile-a-second light rays travel in a year.

Although they are the oldest objects yet studied, the institute said, "there are traces in their atmospheres of heavier chemical elements made by now dead

stars that were born earlier." The study, which the institute said gives astronomers "a look back in time to the composition of the galaxy when it and indeed the universe itself were very young," was made with the 200-inch telescope on Palomar Mountain and the 100-inch telescope on Mount Wilson both in California.
