## Contract Bridge

### A VITAL PROCESS

It is impossible to play a sound  
game of bridge without counting  
one's losers (or, conversely, one's  
winning tricks) the moment the  
dummy is spread—and before even  
touching a card on the board.

The assumption is that the de-  
clarer in the following deal did not  
bother with this process!

South dealer.  
East-West vulnerable.

The bidding:  
South West North East  
1 ♠ Pass 2 ♣ Pass Pass  
2 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ Pass Pass  
4 ♠ Pass Pass Pass

The bidding was correct through-  
out, and the final contract should  
have been a laydown. Strange  
things can happen, however, at the  
bridge table!

West's opening lead was the heart  
seven, and the moment North put  
down the A-3-2 of hearts, declarer  
reached for the deuce, no doubt re-  
membering his own queen-jack. It  
was an expensive finesse! East won  
the trick and quickly shifted to di-  
amonds—and now South was facing  
four sure losers! West shrewdly put  
up his ace of clubs on South's first  
lead of that suit toward dummy,  
and the defence did not delay in  
cashing two diamond tricks!

It was extremely silly for South to  
finesse the opening lead when, by  
putting up the ace, he could count  
ten sure winners (and only three  
losers, at most) unless he ran up  
against the most awful breaks.

The line of play that fairly shout-  
ed for recognition was to put up the  
heart ace, then to draw only two  
rounds of trumps, keeping the queen  
in dummy. Next, knock out the club  
ace. (If the ace was held up, con-  
tinue with a high club, discarding a  
diamond from the closed hand.)  
Instead of going down a trick, de-  
clarer would thus assure himself of  
making five-odd.
