

**P. Y. P. S.
Conference**

On Friday evening, September 2, a group of young people representing the various Presbyterian Young People's Societies on the Island gathered at Camp Keir, French River, for the sixth annual weekend Conference and Rally. This conference was under the leadership of Rev. L. E. Blaikie, Director, with Mr. Douglas Fox, student minister in New London charge for the summer months, as theme speaker. Mr. Fox is a third year student at Knox College, Toronto.

On Saturday morning the young people participated in softball and also a lively volleyball game.

After dinner the young people assembled for the first address, "Missionary Motive", on the theme, "The Missionary Call of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ". Mr. Fox based his remarks on Matthew 28 and considered with the young people the real meaning of Christian Missions and the claim Christ has on our lives. He mentioned three motives which should send us forth to tell the Gospel.

Later in the afternoon a swim was enjoyed. In the evening the young people gathered for campfire followed by lunch. At 10:00 a.m. on Sunday an impressive communion service was conducted by Rev. L. E. Blaikie at Geddie Memorial Church. At 11:00 a.m. the young people again assembled at Geddie Memorial Church for morning worship. At 4:00 p.m. Mr. Fox delivered his second theme address, "Missionary Aim", using as his text Acts 1:8. He brought out why a missionary goes to a foreign field, stating that the primary aim is so to present Jesus Christ with the power of the Holy Spirit that the unconverted will accept Him as their personal Saviour. This involves a personal giving of our lives to Jesus Christ and we must know Christ in our lives personally and seek to follow Him in our daily lives, getting to know Him better through Scripture and prayer.

Sunday evening at 7:30 Rev. L. E. Blaikie led a worship service. The Scripture lesson, John 3:1-17, was read by Roddie Hickox, and Randolph Nicholson led in prayer. Mr. Blaikie considered with the young people chapter 1 of the Epistle of John, following which several questions were raised by the young people and discussed. Collection for the evening to be used for the work of a school in India.

At 10:30 a.m. on Monday the president, Roddie Hickox, presided over the Council Meeting, which was opened with prayer by Reverend L. E. Blaikie. The roll call was answered by 38 young people. The minutes of last year's Conference were read and approved.

It was moved and seconded that we again hold a Fall Rally—place to be decided by the Executive. It was moved and seconded that our missionary project this year be to assist Miss Mary Nichol—missionary in the John Hospital, India; also that each Society continue to contribute \$10.00 to the Keir Camp Fund. Rev. E. H. Bean reported that the Camp had been painted during the past year.

After some discussion it was decided to make a change in the way in which banner points were awarded. The meeting closed with the Benediction by Reverend M. C. Currie.

In the afternoon, a worship service was led by Maureen Forbes. The Scripture lesson, Romans 12, was read responsively and Priscilla Richards led in prayer. A resume of the weekend activities was given by the president.

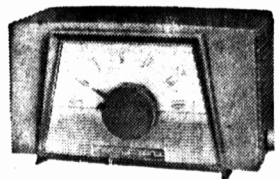
