Island Ayrshires Score Again In Dominion-Wide Competition

In competition with Ayrshire cows from all across Canada, Island Ayrshires have again demonstrated their ability to produce. Among many fine records in the May list of cows completing R. O. P. records recently released by the Canadian Ayrshire Breeders' Club, Island cows were the top producers in three classes and placed second in two others.

Columario Molly, bred by J. W. Lewis, Freetown, and now owned by Willard Prowse, Brackley, was the top producing Junior 4-year-old, 365 day class with 15,002 lbs. Milk, 653 lbs. Fat, 4.35 per cent for 179 per cent of the breed class average which is the requirement for qualification in R.O.P. The Mature cow, Royalty Lady Milly, owned by Col. F. I. Andrew, also produced 179 per cent of requirements for butterfat in topping the mature, 365 day, 2X class with 14,491 lbs. Milk, 708 lbs. Fat, 4.89 per cent. A granddaughter of this class leading producer sells in the Island Ayrshire sale May 28th. A 9-year-old Ontario owned cow, Midhurst Snowflake, produced 19,455 lbs. Milk, 798 lbs. Fat, 4.09 per cent, in this same class but on three times a day milking.

Kirkside Ora, owned by George Matheson and Son, Milton, has completed her first mature record of 12,374 lbs. Milk, 584 lbs. Fat, 4.72 per cent. As was reported last month, Ora was the top Canadian producer in her class for 1953. She now has an average of 12,702 lbs. Milk, 552 lbs. Fat in her first three lactations.

The top producing Junior 2-year-old, 305 day division, was Raeburn Trinket, owned by Earl MacRae and Son, New Wiltshire, with 11,011 lbs. Milk, 473 lbs. Fat, 4.3 per cent for 164 per cent of requirements. She was sired by Charlottetown Sir Roderick 7th. Another daughter of this bull owned by the Experimental Farm, Charlottetown was 5th in the Junior 2-year-old, 365 day class.

Col. F. I. Andrew's Junior 2-year-old, Aberdovy Happy Verna was the second highest in the 365 day class with 14,053 lbs. Milk, 562 lbs. Fat, 4.0 per cent for 177 per cent of requirements. This high producing 2-year-old was bred by Mr. Huntley, Vernon Bridge. Greendale Linda Lou, owned by Willard Prowse, Brackley, was the second highest producer in the Senior 3-year-old, 365 day class.

Two daughters of Glengarry Bit O'Fashion have completed good records in the Mature, 305 day class. They are: Raeburn Fashion Princess, owned by Earl MacRae and Son, with 12,231 lbs. Milk, 522 lbs. Fat, 4.27 per cent, and Glendale Bell, owned by Willard Prowse, with 11,133 lbs. Milk, 503 lbs. Fat, 4.52 per cent. A Junior 3-year-old daughter of Bit O'Fashion, owned by the Experimental Farm, produced 134 per cent of requirements in the 305 day division. Bit O'Fashion, the sire of these high producing cows, is the sire of two of the animals being sold in the Prince Edward Island Ayrshire Sale May 28th. He is also the grandsire of eleven and the great grandsire of three other animals in the sale.

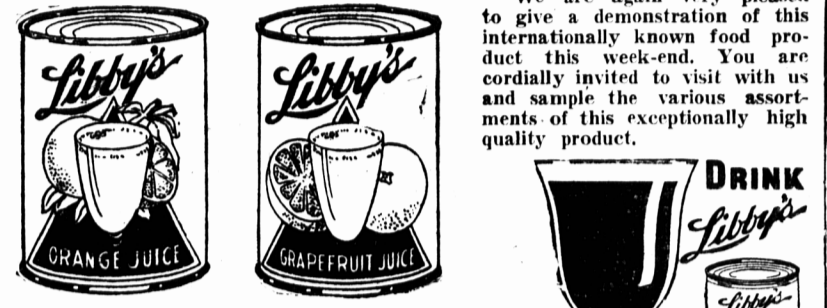
