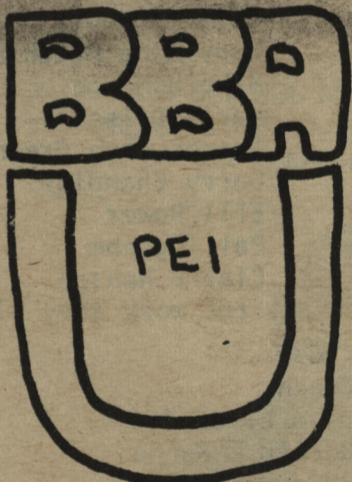
Panther Lounge of the Barn. Please come out and support "your" freshman class.

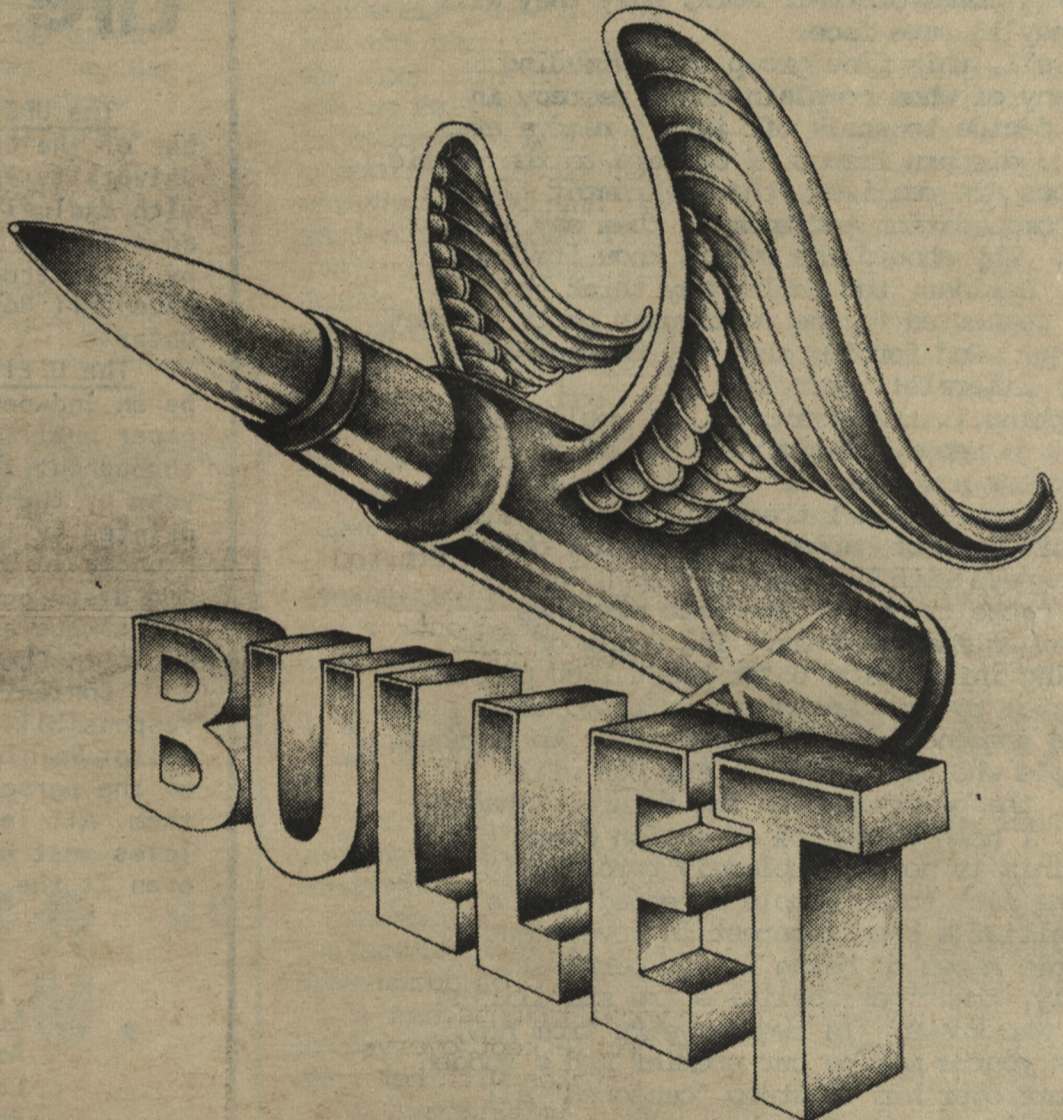
