

Hints to Bathers.

The following advice to swimmers and bathers is given in the report of the Royal Humane Society, just issued:— On the subject of bathing the committee recommend to the notice of the public a code of rules published by the society, entitled "Caution to Bathers."

Avoid bathing within two hours after a meal. Avoid bathing when exhausted by fatigue or from any other cause. Avoid lathing when the body is cooling after perspiration.

Avoid bathing altogether in the open air if, after having been a short time in the water, it causes a sense of chilliness with numbness of the hands and feet. Bathe when the body is warm, provided no time is lost in getting in the water.

Avoid chilling the body by sitting or standing undressed on the banks or in boats after having been in the water. Avoid remaining too long in the water—leave the water immediately there is the slightest feeling of chilliness.

The vigorous and strong may bathe early in the morning on an empty stomach. The young, and those who are weak, had better bathe two or three hours after a meal—the best time for such is from two or three hours after breakfast.

Those who are weak are subject to attacks of giddiness or faintness, and those who suffer from palpitation and other sense of discomfort at the heart, should not bathe without first consulting their medical officer.

How Children Grow.

A table prepared by a French savant gives the following data on the growth of children: During the first year after birth the growth in stature is about seven and a half inches; from two to three it is four five; from three to four an inch and a half; from four to six, two and a quarter inches annually; from seven to eight, two and half; from eight to twelve, two inches; from twelve to thirteen, one and eight-tenths; from thirteen to fourteen, two and a quarter; fifteen to sixteen, two; sixteen to seventeen, nearly two. After this, though growth continues until twenty-one and sometimes years after, its rate diminishes. Increase in stride shows weakness of constitution or imperfect health.

The Sunflower—Its Value.

As an egg-producing food for poultry there is nothing better than the ripe seeds of the sunflower. It is a plant easily grown in any vacant corner of a garden or along the field fences. The variety known as the Mammoth Russian is the best and most easily grown, the plants requiring no special care. A little before the seed is ripe and ready to drop, cut off the heads, then store them away in a dry place for use as required. The plant is very productive of seed, often yielding at the rate of 100 bush. per acre. Sunflower seed is of an oily nature, and not only stimulates egg-production in fowls, but gives a fine gloss in their plumage.
