Avondale Meeting. A large meeting of electors took place at Avondale on the 17th inst. Ronald Carmichael, Esq., occupied the chair. Mr. A. A. McLean, of Charlottetown, was the first speaker. He reviewed the record of the Government, dwelling, particularly, on the matter of public works, debentures, two-thirds vote, disfranchisement bill, etc. He was followed by Mr. P. W. Kneghan, who referred to the Land Office, Mortgage vote, the Road Machine, the cost of Legislation, the disfranchisement of Dominion Socials, the Gerrymander, and the protection promises of the Peters party. It was moved by Mr. Joseph D. Fraser, seconded by Mr. Patk. O'Donnell and unanimously Resolved, That this meeting strongly disapproves of the measures of the present Government, and declares that the present representatives of the district, Messrs. McDonald and Forbes do not possess cur confidence.

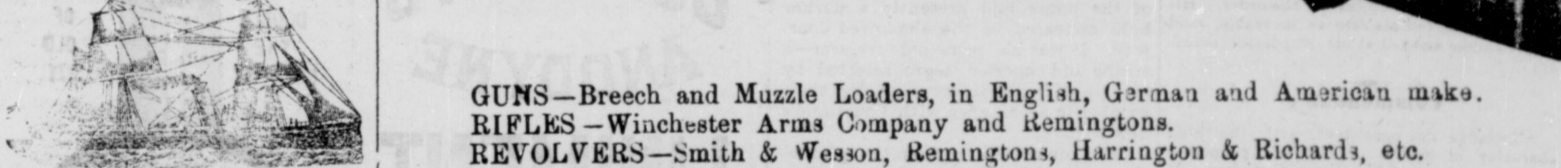

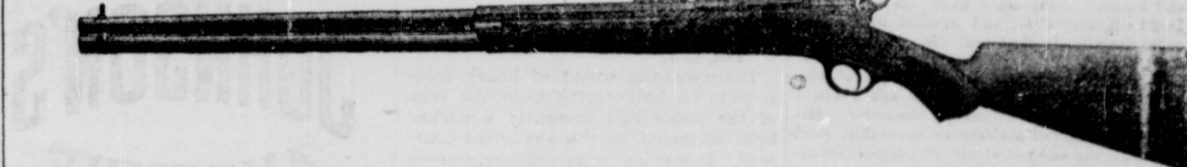
