Beware Of Numbered Christmas Cards Says Bureau

With the season of Christmas drawing close and with it the usual flood of pressure salesmanship, the Better Business Bureau of Toronto has issued a warning regarding one type of sales gimmick which its says is closely bordering on a racket. The bureau is warning against those firms which in the past have been sending through the mails packages of unsorted, pre-printed Christmas cards. In this business the firms send out the packages under the guise that the greater portion of the return goes to some charity. The recipients are informed that they are under no obligation to reply, but in most cases a suggestion is included that the sum of at least \$1 be remitted. The firms engaged in this scheme claim that this money will help to maintain or look after the handicapped artists who allegedly are the designers of the Christmas cards.

The bureau in its warning admits that despite investigation the financial particulars of these firms remains a mystery. From the little information they have been able to gather, it has been estimated that in Canada alone the possible gross income from this mail business runs to about \$500,000.
