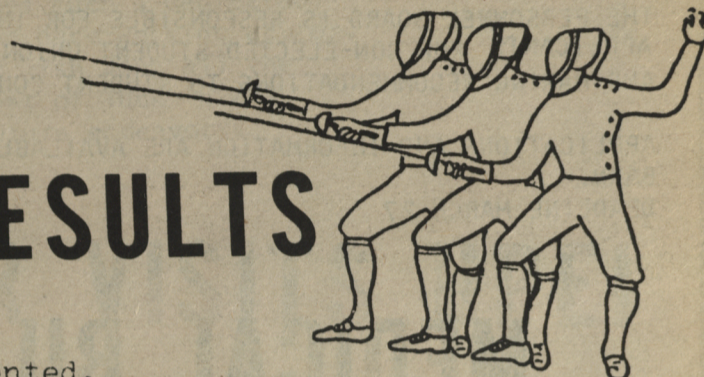
I was told this year's turnout was a first for UPEI and also for the

# FENCING TOURNAMENT RESULTS

## Tournament Results

In spite of the poor weather over the weekend, the fencing tournament held at UPEI saw all four Atlantic provinces represented, thus making the event not only the largest fencing competition held on P.E.I. to date, but also the biggest team encounter in the Maritimes. The 50 fencers included the best in the region so that competition was keen and the quality was good, especially in foil and epee. Sabre fencing suffered somewhat from a general lack of experience and skill.

Overall champions of this Atlantic Club Team Tournament were the Dartmouth Corsairs. Men's foil was won by N.B. with UPEI placing fourth ahead of Memorial and Dalhousie. The first place in ladies' foil was captured by Dalhousie, the epee by N.B., and the sabre by Dartmouth. The latter event ceded the only medal for the UPEI Club, namely a third.

While the UPEI team did not place as well as had been hoped, the losses were very often by a mere 5-4 margin and some fine fencing was displayed. Once again Walter Wilkins gave the best performance, snatching victories for his club when it seemed impossible. Other members of the UPEI team were R. Steevensz, S. MacEachern, B. MacLeish, I.
