Withdrawal of the Steam Navigation Company's Steamers.

What About the "Northern Light"?

OTTAWA, Jan. 28.

In due course Mr. Davies made his motion, to-day, for "copies of all reports made by the Steamboat Inspectors of hulls and machinery of the steamers 'St. Lawrence,' 'Princess of Wales' and 'Northern Light,' since the appointment of the Inspectors," etc. Judiciously, and rightly, he refrained from making an attack upon the Minister of Marine and Fisheries...

The reply of the Minister was equally modest. He stated that the certificates expired on the 31st of October; and he thought it was the duty of the owners of the boats, who receive a subsidy of \$10,000 a year, to supply others to take their place while they were under repair...

The Tenth Day of January, 1884.

In the matter of the application of Edward Jarvis Hodgson and George Wright Hodgson, Executors of the last Will and Testament of Daniel Hodgson, deceased, for leave to enter a suggestion upon the roll of a certain Judgment entered in the Supreme Court, wherein the said Daniel Hodgson and Margaret Leah Hodgson are plaintiffs, and James Thomas Fraser, defendant, to the effect that it manifestly appears to the Court that the said Edward Jarvis Hodgson and George Wright Hodgson, as such executors as aforesaid are entitled to have execution of the said judgment, and to issue execution thereon.
