U.S. Senator Blasts
State Dept. Action

WASHINGTON (CP)—Senator George Allen suggests the state department had acted clumsily in engaging publicly in a nuclear policy fight with the Canadian government.

It is difficult to understand how it was seen fit to express official displeasure with Canada by a public rebuke when no such statement was made regarding General de Gaulle's disruption of the Com m o n w e a l t h involving Britain at Brussels, the Vermont Republican said in a statement which he will read at the opening of a Senate foreign relations subcommittee investigation today.

The investigation will be held behind closed doors but Allen, a close friend of Canada, said he wanted his initial statement made public Sunday to show that while he is not attempting to prejudice the hearing, he at least will have Canada and the U.S. know what course he intends to follow.

"It seems to me very clear on the basis of our relations with Canada over many years that overt and clumsy efforts on the part of any U.S. official to influence Canadian policy decisions are likely to achieve results opposite to the one intended," says Allen who will preside at the investigation.

QUITO, Ecuador (AP)—A landslide struck Sunday at Bithin, a farming community in the Andes mourning the death of 100 pupils and four teachers on the collapse of a Roman Catholic parochial school.

Seven homes were destroyed by the landslide, looted by heavy rains that contributed to the disaster at the Heart of Mary College Friday.

In spite of further rains, funeral services were held for 62 children and 10 adults. Parents carried in the dead bodies of some of the children, which established the day completion of the mass burial.
